VERKLARING VAN NASIONALE
GEDENKWAARDIGHEDE

Kragtens die bevoegdheid my verleen by artikel 10 (1) van die Wet op Nasionale Gedenkwaardighede, 1969 (Wet 28 van 1969), verklaar ek, Johannes Petrus van der Spuy, Minister van Nasionale Opvoeding, hierby die dubbelverdiepinggeboue bekend as Transvalia, Alma, Bosmanhuis en Tinettahuis, te Dorpstraat 125, 129, 133 en 135, Stellenbosch, tot nasionale gedenkwaardighede.

Beskrywing

Die historiese dubbelverdiepinggeboue bekend as Transvalia, Alma, Bosmanhuis en Tinettahuis, te Dorpstraat 125, 129, 133 en 135, Stellenbosch, en geleë op die eiendomme wat as volg beskryf word:

(a) Die restant van Erf 1123, geleë in die munisipaliteit en afdeling Stellenbosch en groot honderd agt-en-sestig (168) vierkante roede vier-en-dertig (34) vierkante voet.

(b) Die restant van Erf 1128, geleë in die munisipaliteit en afdeling Stellenbosch en groot een-en-tagtig (81) vierkante roede sewe-en-negentig (97) vierkante voet.

Grondbrief 1971/1967, gedateer 1 Junie 1967 (paragraaf VII).

(c) Erf 1133, geseë aan Dorpstraat, gemerk No. 13, in die munisipaliteit en afdeling Stellenbosch en groot tweeaan-estig (62) vierkante roede honderd ses-en-dertig (136) vierkante voet.

(d) Die restant van Erf 1134, geleë in die munisipaliteit en afdeling Stellenbosch en groot twintigduisend nege-honderd drie-en-dertig (20 933) vierkante voet.

(e) Erf 1142, geleë in die munisipaliteit en afdeling Stellenbosch en groot sewe-en-sesig (67) vierkante roede honderd-en-twintig (120) vierkante voet.

Historiese en argitektoniese belang

Hierdie dubbelverdiepinggeboue in oorwegend Georgiaanse styl dateer vermoedelik almal uit die begin van die 19de eeu. Die groep huise vorm 'n feitlik onafgebroke eenheid en vorm as sodanig ook 'n belangrike element in die straatbeeld van die historiese Dorpstraat.

DECLARATION OF NATIONAL
MONUMENTS

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Johannes Petrus van der Spuy, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the double-storeyed buildings known as Transvalia, Alma, Bosman House and Tinetta House, at 125, 129, 133 and 135 Dorp Street, Stellenbosch, to be national monuments.

Description

The historic double-storeyed buildings known as Transvalia, Alma, Bosman House and Tinetta House at 125, 129, 133 and 135 Dorp Street, Stellenbosch, and situate on the properties described as follows:

(a) The remainder of Erf 1123, situate in the Municipality and Division of Stellenbosch and measuring one hundred and sixty-eight (168) square rods thirty-four (34) square feet.

(b) The remainder of Erf 1128, situate in the Municipality and Division of Stellenbosch and measuring eighty-one (81) square rods ninety-seven (97) square feet.

Crown Grant 1971/1967, dated 1 June 1967 (paragraph VII).

(c) Erf 1133, situate on Dorp Street, marked No. 13, in the Municipality and Division of Stellenbosch and measuring sixty-two (62) square rods one hundred and thirty-six (136) square feet.

Crown Grant 1971/1967, dated 1 June 1967 (paragraph V).

(d) The remainder of Erf 1134, situate in the Municipality and Division of Stellenbosch and measuring twenty thousand nine hundred and thirty-three (20 933) square feet.

Crown Grant 1971/1967, dated 1 June 1967 (paragraph VI).

(e) Erf 1142, situate in the Municipality and Division of Stellenbosch and measuring sixty-seven (67) square rods one hundred and twenty (120) square feet.

Historical and architectural interest

These double-storeyed buildings, in the predominantly Georgian style, probably all date from the beginning of the 19th century. This group of houses forms an almost perfect unit and also forms an important element in the street scene of the historic Dorp Street.
