

NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE DUTCH REFORMED CHURCH (N.G.) AND THE RING-WALL ON THE REMAINDER OF ERF 46, PHILADELPHIA

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Pieter Gerhardus Jacobus Koornhof, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the Dutch Reformed (N.G.) church building and the ring-wall surrounding it, on the remainder of Erf 46, at Philadelphia, to be a national monument.

Description

The historic Dutch Reformed (N.G.) church building and the ring-wall, on the remainder of Erf 46, Philadelphia, described as certain piece of land situate in the Cape Division at the Koebergen, being the remaining extent of that part of the perpetual quitrent place Dassen Valley, and measuring fifteen (15) morgen, five hundred and twenty-six decimal six hundred and eighty (526,680) square roods.

Historical and architectural interest

This imposing church, the nave of which was consecrated in 1864, was enlarged in 1910 by the addition of two wings, the vestibule and the stately tower. 10/2/610.
