SCIENCE.—PROCLAMATION OF A MONU-
MENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by paragraph (a) of sub-section (1) of section *eight* of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I hereby proclaim to be a monument the cornice and pediment, including the sculpture therein, of the building at 131 Bree Street, Cape Town.

Description.—The cornice and pediment, including the sculpture therein, on the building situate on certain piece of land in Bree Street, Cape Town, Cape Division, being Lot No. 3 in Block No. 1, measuring 27 square rods 103 square feet 36 square inches, presently held by Inag (Proprietary), Limited, by virtue of Deed of Transfer No. 6727, dated 20th May, 1944.

Aesthetic and Historical Interest.—In the cornice and pediment there is a sculpture designed by the well-known Cape architect Anton Anreith. It is the only example left of such embossment on a building in Cape Town, of which there were formerly at least twenty.
