

NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE HISTORIC GUARD
HOUSE AT BARBERTON

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Willem Adriaan Cruywagen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the historic building known as the Guard House, situated on the corner of Lee and Judge Streets, Barberton, to be a national monument.

Description

The historic Guard house, situate on undivided townlands on the corner of Lee and Judge Streets in Barberton, Transvaal.

Crown Grant 149/1915, dated 7 May 1915.

Historical and architectural interest

This wood and corrugated iron guard house was erected during 1901 to protect the concentration camp, the camp hospital and the town during the Anglo-Boer War. It is probably the only surviving blockhouse of its kind. 10/2/638.
