Charles Wood Cottage, situated at 4, 6, 8 and 10 Cross Street, 8A Bartholomew Street and 1 and 2 Sheblon Lane, respectively, in the Artificers' Square, Grahamstown, to be national monuments.

Description

The property with the seven Settler cottages thereon as described above, situate on a certain piece of land in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being Erf 5254, Grahamstown, and measuring two thousand three hundred and twentynine (2 329) square metres.

Consolidated Title 14924/1970, dated 2 June 1970.

Historical and architectural interest

These Settler cottages were erected by artisans during the eighteen-twenties on land granted to them by the Government on the understanding that a house of burnt brick or stone be erected within 18 months. Most of the properties were, however, only transferred to their owners in 1827.

The cottages form a unique historical and architectural complex which is closely associated with the British Settlers of 1820. 10/2/645.
