

NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH
CLYDE HOUSE AND TWO ADJOINING
BUILDINGS, AT 25 DONKIN STREET, BEAU-
FORT WEST

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Willem Adriaan Cruywagen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the building known as Clyde House thereon, together with the two adjoining buildings, situated at 25 Donkin Street, Beaufort West, to be a national monument.

Description

The property with the three historic buildings thereon, namely certain piece of land being Erf 515, Beaufort West, situate in the Municipality and Division of Beaufort West and measuring three hundred and eighty-seven (387) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 29665/1977, dated 21 November 1977.

Historical and architectural interest

These three buildings all possess predominantly Victorian characteristics and form a unique architectural complex in the historic core of Beaufort West. The double-storeyed house known as Clyde House is particularly noteworthy and was erected in about 1845 by Dr James Christie. 10/2/665.
