

## NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

## DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH THE BUILDING KNOWN AS "LONSDALE CHAMBERS" THEREON, AT KING WILLIAM'S TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Willem Adriaan Cruywagen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the building known as "Lonsdale Chambers" thereon, at King William's Town, to be a national monument.

*Description*

The property with the building known as "Lonsdale Chambers" thereon, being the remainder of Erf 1007, Erf 1010 and Erf 1009, King William's Town.

Deed of Transfer 1232/1920, dated 17 November 1920.

*Historical and architectural interest*

This double-storey building with its predominantly neo-Classical features was designed and built in 1924 by the architects Cordreaux, Farrow and Stocks. The building was named after James Faunce Lonsdale, founder member and later secretary of the British Kaf-rarian Savings Bank. 10/2/672.
