PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section eight of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I hereby proclaim to be monuments the Greenmarket Square, the Riebeeck Square and the Church Square, Cape Town.

DESCRIPTION.

1. Greenmarket Square.—Bounded north-east by Shortmarket Street, south-east by Block EE, south-west by Longmarket Street, north-west by Block JJ, excluding portion of Berg Street between Shortmarket and Longmarket Streets, Cape Town.

2. Riebeeck Square.—Bounded north-east by Short-market Street, south-east by Bree Street, south-west by Church Street, north-west by Buitengracht Street, Cape Town.

3. Church Square.—Bounded north-west by Parliament Street, north-east by Lot CC and Lot Club, south-east by Lot Club, Lot NM, Lot THS Annex, Lot NM² and Remainder Lot No. 6, south-west by Spin Street, Cape Town.

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

- 1. Greenmarket Square.—One of the squares round which Cape Town developed. In early times it was the site of the vegetable and fruit market.
- 2. Riebeeck Square.—One of the squares round which Cape Town developed. It was first known as Boerenplein, and later as Hottentot Square. Here the farmers outspanned their wagons and off-loaded their products.
- Church Square.—One of the squares round which Cape Town developed. It was the square used by churchgoers of the Groote Kerk,
