Under and by virtue of the powers vested in me by sub-section (1) of section *eight* of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I hereby proclaim to be a monument the Vault of the Woutersen-Wessels family, Green Point, Cape Town.

DESCRIPTION.

The Vault, surrounding wall and the land enclosed by the wall, situate in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being the remainder of Erf No. 308, Green Point, as per Deed of Grant, dated 2nd February, 1958 (Cape Freeholds, Vol. 15, No. 20).

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

The architecture is most interesting and there is reason to believe that it is the work of the well-known architect Hermann Schutte.

Some prominent citizens have been buried there, *inter* alia Adv. M. L. Wessels, brother of Sir John Wessels, former Chief Justice of the Union.
