

### *Description*

The properties with the five Settler cottages thereon, namely:

1. Certain piece of land situate in the Municipality of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being the remainder of Erf 4037, Grahamstown, and measuring twenty-eight 28 square roods, one hundred and twenty-two (122) square feet.

2. Certain piece of land situate as above, being the remainder of Erf 4034, Grahamstown, and measuring twelve (12) square roods, one hundred and two (102) square feet, one hundred and eight (108) square inches.

3. Certain piece of land situate as above, being Erf 4036, Grahamstown, and measuring fifty-three (53) square roods, fifty-six (56) square feet.

Deed of Transfer 20850/1968, dated 18 September 1968 (paragraphs 1, 2 and 3).

4. Certain piece of land situate in the Municipality of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being Erf 4038, Grahamstown, and measuring twenty-four (24) square roods, seventy-eight (78) square feet.

Deed of Transfer 28901/1968, dated 10 December 1968. 10/2/734.

### *Historical and architectural interest*

These Settler cottages were erected by artisans during the eighteen-twenties on land granted to them by the Government on the understanding that a house of burnt brick or stone be erected within eighteen months. Most of the properties were, however, only transferred to their owners in 1827.

The cottages form a unique historical and architectural complex which is closely associated with the British Settlers of 1820.
