*Beskrywing*

Die eiendom bekend as Cuyler Manor, met die historiese geboue en strukture daarop, synde ongeveer sewe hektaar grond geleë op Plaas 320/1, distrik Uitenhage, en begrens aan die noordekant deur TR 15/1, aan die suide- en die westekant deur grond ont-eien deur die Suid-Afrikaanse Spoorweë vir spoorwegwerkswinkels, en aan die ooste- kant deur 'n lyn wat parallel met die westelike grens van Plaas 320/1 loop op 'n afstand van 260 meter oos daarvan, soos aangetoon op Diagram 2052 1B wat geliasseer is in die kantore van die Munisipaliteit van Uitenhage en die Raad vir Nasionale Gedenkwaardighede.

*Historiese en argitektoniese belang*

Hierdie oorwegend Kaaps-Hollandse plaasopstal is in 1814 deur kolonel Jacob Glen Cuyler, landdroos van Uitenhage, opgerig. Kolonel Cuyler was ten nouste verbonde met die vestiging van die Britse Setlaars van 1820. 10/2/757.

*Historical and architectural interest*

The corner-stone of this church building, which was designed in the style of the Dutch Renaissance, was laid on 18 July 1904 by General Louis Botha and the building was taken into use on 24 February 1905. It is the oldest Nederduitsch Hervormde Church building in Pretoria and its history is closely interwoven with the history of the development of the Afrikaans suster churches in the Transvaal. 10/2/759.

DECLARATION OF THE CUYLER MANOR  
HOMESTEAD, AT UITENHAGE

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Teunis Nicolaas Hendrik Janson, Minister of National Education, hereby declare a portion of the original Cuyler Manor farm, with the historic dwelling, as well as the visitors' house, coach-house, wagon-house and mill-house thereon, at Uitenhage, to be a national monument.

*Description*

The property known as Cuyler Manor with the historic buildings and structures thereon, being approximately seven hectares of land situate on Farm 320/1, District of Uitenhage, and bounded on the northern side by TR 15/1, on the southern and western sides by the land appropriated by the South African Railways for railway workshops and on the eastern side by a line running parallel to the western boundary of Farm 320/1 at a distance of 260 metres east thereof, as shown on Diagram 2052 1B which is filed in the offices of the Municipality of Uitenhage and the National Monuments Council.

Deed of Transfer 32405/1965, dated 22 December 1965.

*Historical and architectural interest*

This predominantly Cape Dutch homestead was erected in 1814 by Colonel Jacob Glen Cuyler, landdrost of Uitenhage. Colonel Cuyler was closely associated with the settlement of the British Settlers of 1820. 10/2/757.
