## NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

## DECLARATION OF THE SYNAGOGUE, KING WILLIAM'S TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Teunis Nicolaas Hendrik Janson, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the Synagogue (previously the Wesleyan School) thereon, in Berkeley Street, King William's Town, to be a national monument.

## Description

Certain piece of land with the Synagogue thereon, being originally perpetual quitrent and being Division 2 of Lots 2, 3 and 4, Berkeley Street (now known as Erf 905), in the Town of King William's Town, Division of King William's Town, in extent thirty-two (32) square roods, nine decimal thirty-six (9.36) square feet

Deed of Transfer 461/1908, dated 1 September 1908.

## Historical and architectural interest

This predominantly neo-Gothic building probably dates from the eighteen-fifties and was used for several decades as a school by the Wesleyans. The builing has been used as a synogogue since 1908. With the two adjoining buildings, which were also originally erected by the Wesleyan Church, it forms an impressive building complex. 10/2/773.
