

NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969
DECLARATION OF THE GRAAFF-REINET
PHARMACY, AT 24 CALEDON STREET,
GRAAFF-REINET

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Teunis Nicolaas Hendrik Janson, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the building known as the Graaff-Reinet Pharmacy, together with all its historical contents, as described more fully below, situated at 24 Caledon Street, Graaff-Reinet, to be a national monument.

Description

The double-storeyed building known as the Graaff-Reinet Pharmacy, situated on certain piece of land in the Town of Graaff-Reinet in Caledon and Napier Streets, being part of portion of Lot 12 (now called Erf 1372, Graaff-Reinet), together with the following antiques therein: Eight light blue glass bottles, eighteen dark blue glass bottles, three dark blue castor oil glass bottles, three light green coconut glass bottles, nine mineral water glass bottles, fourteen pale green glass bottles, fourteen medium green glass bottles, three dark green glass bottles, three blue china jars with lids, ten pink china jars with lids, nineteen stoneware jars, two Doulton stoneware jars with brass taps, one baby scale with wicker seat, one gross weighing beam scale, one fine weighing pharmaceutical scale, one copper formalin fumigator, one papier mache bust (Lennon), one "Lennons Echte Huis Apotheek", fifty-five gold inlaid wide mouth large dispensing bottles, sixty-seven gold inlaid wide mouth small dispensing bottles, thirty-five gold inlaid narrow mouth large dispensing bottles, forty gold inlaid narrow mouth small dispensing bottles, one oak swivel office chair, one oak roll-top office desk, one lyre-back art nouveau chair (Ashes of Roses), one wall-mounted filing cabinet with twelve drawers, one standing label cabinet with fourteen drawers and one wall-hanging mercury barometer marked P. Maffia.
