

## NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

## DECLARATION OF THE SO-CALLED OLIVE SCHREINER HOUSE, SITUATED AT 9 GRUNDLING STREET, DE AAR

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Teunis Nicolaas Hendrik Janson, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the so-called Olive Schreiner house thereon, at 9 Grundling Street, De Aar, to be a national monument.

*Description*

The property with the so-called Olive Schreiner house thereon, being certain piece of land situate in the Municipality of De Aar, Administrative District of Philipstown, being Erf 3982, De Aar, and measuring 1 571 (one thousand five hundred and seventy-one) square metres .

Deed of Transfer 18346/1979, dated 12 July 1979.

*Historical and architectural interest*

In this house the well-known authoress Olive Schreiner (1855-1920) and her husband, S. C. Cronwright-Schreiner, lived from 1908 to 1913. Here she completed her book "Woman and Labour" and wrote two articles for special occasions entitled "Thoughts About Women" and "Closer Union". 10/2/798.
