Historical and architectural interest

The Pinelands Garden City originated with Richard Stuttaford, who actively promoted this new concept. The town planner and architect, Albert J. Thompson, drew up the plans in 1919. The original section known as The Meadway was laid out in 1923, and built on State land that previously formed part of the Uitvlught Forest Reserve. This is the oldest so-called garden city in South Africa. 10/2/904.
