DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH THE
DUTCH REFORMED CHURCH BUILDING THEREON,
AT UPINGTON

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the Dutch Reformed Church Building thereon, at Upington, to be a national monument.

Description

The property, together with the Dutch Reformed Church thereon, being certain piece of land known as the Dutch Reformed Church Site (now known as the Remainder of Erf 463, Upington), situate in the Township of Upington, Division of Gordonia, and measuring 7 520 square metres.

Historical and architectural interest

This neo-Gothic church, designed by the firm of architects F. W. and F. Hesse of Cape Town, was erected in 1911 and officially inaugurated on 13 April 1912. 10/2/929.
