WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE TWO PROPERTIES WITH THE ST JOHN'S ANGLICAN CHURCH BUILDING AND THE PARSONAGE THEREON, AT CLANWILLIAM

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the two properties, together with the St John's Anglican Church building and the Parsonage thereon, at Clanwilliam, to be national monuments.

Description

The two properties with the St John's Anglican Church building and the Parsonage thereon, namely:

- (a) Certain piece of land situate in the Division of Clanwilliam, being a subdivided portion of the property transferred to I. L. Sharp (now known as Erf 189, Clanwilliam), and measuring 84 square roods and 42,75 square feet; and
- (b) certain two pieces of perpetual quitrent land, being Erven 2 and 9 (now known as Erf 43, Clanwilliam), situate in the village of Clanwilliam, in the Division of Clanwilliam, and measuring 426 square roods and 28 square feet.

Deed of Transfer 189/1870, dated 16 May 1870 (paragraphs 1 and 2).

Historical and architectural interest

This neo-Gothic church building, designed by Sophia Gray, was erected in 1865 on the remains of an earlier Settler church. The building was inaugurated in 1866 by Bishop Gray.

The parsonage, which presumably dates from the 1840s, is an exceedingly beautiful Old Cape thatched cottage. 10/2/981.
