

Description

The property with the historical dwelling known as Leinster Hall thereon, as well as the outbuildings, and described as follows:

(i) Certain land situate in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being the Remainder of Erf 95031, Cape Town at Gardens, and measuring as such six hundred and seventy-seven (677) square metres; and

(ii) certain land situate as above, being Erf 95030, Cape Town at Gardens, and measuring five hundred and sixteen (516) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 19903/1980, dated 19 June 1980 (paragraphs 1 and 2).

Historical and architectural interest

Leinster Hall was built in the 1850's by Sebastiaan Hofmeyr on a plot which previously formed part of the farm Weltevreden. The original part of the outbuildings was erected simultaneously. Leinster Hall, with its predominantly Georgian characteristics, its noteworthy garden and its Victorian verandah, is one of four remaining historical manor-houses in this region of Cape Town. 10/2/986.
