

Description

The property, together with the two church buildings thereon, being certain piece of abolished quitrent land, situate in the Municipality of Springbok, Division of Namaqualand, being Erf 432, Springbok, and measuring 714 (seven hundred and fourteen) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 5625/1982, dated 15 February 1982.

Historical and architectural interest

This oblong stone building that was erected in 1877 was the first Ned. Geref. Church building in Springbok. It was restored in 1899 and served increasingly as a church building until 1921. The adjacent Jewish Synagogue was erected by M. Klawansky in 1929. The buildings were acquired by the Municipality of Springbok in 1982 for museum purposes. 10/2/994.

Beskrywing

Die eiendom, met inbegrip van die twee kerkgeboue daarop, synde sekere stuk afgeskaft erfpaggrond, geleë in die munisipaliteit Springbok, afdeling Namakwaland, synde Erf 432, Springbok, en groot 714 (sewehonderd-eneveertien) vierkante meter.

Historiese en argitektoniese belang

Hierdie langwerpige klipgeboutjie wat in 1877 opgerig is, was die eerste Ned. Geref. Kerkgebou in Springbok. Dit is in 1899 herstel en het tot 1921 in toenemende mate as kerkgebou gedien. Die aangrensende Joodse Sinagoge is in 1929 deur M. Klawansky opgerig. Die geboue is in 1982 deur die Munisipaliteit van Springbok bekom vir museum-doeleindes. 10/2/994.

DECLARATION OF THE SO-CALLED PEARSON CONSERVATORY AND THE PRINCE ALFRED'S GUARD MEMORIAL IN ST GEORGE'S PARK, PORT ELIZABETH

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the so-called Pearson Conservatory, together with five metres of surrounding land, as well as the Prince Alfred's Guard Memorial, both structures situated on Erf 3182, St George's Park, Port Elizabeth, to be a national monument.

Description

The so-called Pearson Conservatory with five metres of surrounding land, as well as the Prince Alfred's Guard Memorial (excluding the service reservoir), both structures situated on certain piece of land upon the Hill in the Town of Port Elizabeth (now known as Erf 3182, Port Elizabeth).

Crown Grant 91/1864, dated 23 February 1864.

Historical and architectural interest

This impressive conservatory with its Victorian characteristics was designed and erected by Boyd and Son of Paisley, Scotland, dismantled into sections and transported to Port Elizabeth where it was re-erected under the supervision of Mr Frazer of Boyds. The building was officially opened by John X. Merriman on 12 September 1882. The conservatory was named after Mr H. W. Pearson, Mayor of Port Elizabeth from 1871 to 1896.

The Prince Alfred's Guard Memorial is one of the largest and heaviest architectural products in the Victorian idiom manufactured by the Saracen foundry of Walter MacFarlane of Glasgow in Scotland. The structure is a fitting tribute to the memory of the officers and men who made the supreme sacrifice in the Transkei War (1877), Basuto War (1880-1881), Bechuana War (1897) and the Anglo Boer War (1899-1902). 10/2/995.

VERKLARING VAN DIE SOGENAAMDE PEARSON-KONSERVATORIUM EN DIE PRINS ALFRED WAG-GEDENKTEKEN IN ST GEORGESPARK, PORT ELIZABETH

Kragtens die bevoegdheid my verleen by artikel 10 (1) van die Wet op Oorlogsgrafte en Nasionale Gedenkwaardighede, 1969 (Wet 28 van 1969), verklaar ek, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister van Nasionale Opvoeding, hierby die sogenaamde Pearson-konservatorium met vyf meter grond daaromheen asook die Prins Alfred Wag-gedenkteken, beide strukture geleë op Erf 3182, St Georges-park, Port Elizabeth, tot nasionale gedenkwaardigheid.

Beskrywing

Die sogenaamde Pearson-konservatorium met vyf meter grond daaromheen, asook die Prins Alfred Wag-gedenkteken (met uitsluiting van die diensreservoir), beide strukture geleë op sekere stuk grond op die Heuwel in die stad Port Elizabeth (nou bekend as Erf 3182, Port Elizabeth).

Historiese en argitektoniese belang

Hierdie indrukwekkende konservatorium, met sy Victoriaanse kenmerke, is ontwerp en opgerig deur Boyd en Seun van Paisley, Skotland, in seksies afgetakel en na Port Elizabeth vervoer waar dit heropgerig is onder toesig van mnr. Frazer van Boyds. Die gebou is amptelik op 12 September 1882 deur John X. Merriman geopen. Die konservatorium is vernoem na mnr. H. W. Pearson, burgemeester van Port Elizabeth van 1871 tot 1896.

Die Prins Alfred Wag-gedenkteken is een van die grootste en swaarste argitektoniese produkte in die Victoriaanse idioom vervaardig deur die Saracengieterij van Walter MacFarlane van Glasgow in Skotland. Die struktuur is 'n gepaste huldeblyk ter nagedagtenis aan die offisiere en manskappe wat hul lewens verloor het in die Transkei-oorlog (1877) Basoetoeoorlog (1880-1881), Bechuanaoorlog (1897) en die Anglo-Boereoorlog (1899-1902). 10/2/995.
