

WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,
No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH THE SO-
CALLED JAN DE WAAL HOUSE THEREON,
SITUATED AT 93 BREË STREET, CAPE TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the so-called Jan de Waal House thereon, situated at 93 Breë Street, Cape Town, to be a national monument.

Description

The property with the so-called Jan de Waal House thereon, described as follows:

(i) Certain piece of land situate in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being Erf 2151, Cape Town at Cape Town, two hundred and four (204) square metres in extent; and

(ii) certain piece of land situate in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being Erf 2171, Cape Town at Cape Town, one hundred and eighty-eight (188) square metres in extent.

Deed of Transfer 44394/1981, dated 12 October 1981.

Historical and architectural interest

The erf of which this Georgian double-storeyed house stands, was granted to Jan de Waal in 1752. The house, which was presumably erected shortly afterwards, received its Georgian character early in the nineteenth century. 10/2/1012.
