DECLARATION OF THE FAÇADES OF THE ANNE BRYANT ART GALLERY IN ST MARK'S ROAD, THE PUBLIC LIBRARY BUILDING ON THE CORNER OF CAMBRIDGE AND ARGYLE STREETS AND THE CITY HALL IN OXFORD STREET, EAST LONDON

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the façades of the Anne Bryant Art Gallery in St Mark's Road, the Public Library Building on the corner of Cambridge and Argyle Streets and the City Hall in Oxford Street, East London, to be national monuments.

Description

The façades of the Anne Bryant Art Gallery, the Public Library Building and the City Hall, situated on the following erven:

- (a) The Anne Bryant Art Gallery:
- (i) Certain piece of land, being Lot 1, Block F3 of Section A of the Town Commonage (now known as Erf 13700), situate in the Municipality of the City of East London, Division of East London; and
- (ii) certain piece of land, being Lot 2, Block F3 of Section A of the Town Commonage (now known as Erf 13701), situate in the Municipality of the City of East London, Division of East London.

Deed of Transfer 113/1948, dated 4 February 1948 (paragraphs 1 and 2).

(b) The Public Library Building:

Certain piece of land, being Lot A of Waterloo Square (now known as Erf 15275), situate in the Municipality of the City of East London, Division of East London.

Deed of Transfer 855/1958, dated 18 August 1958.

(c) The City Hall:

Certain piece of land, being Waterloo Square (now known as Erf 15274), situate in Ward 3, in the Town of East London, Division of East London.

East London Freeholds 18/21, dated 10 March 1905.

Historical and architectural interest

These three buildings, with their Victorian, neo-classical and Renaissance features, form an integral part of the historical and architectural core of East London. Moreover, each of these buildings can, in its own right, be described as unique. 10/2/1045.
