Kragtens die bevoegdheid my verleen by artikel 8 (1) (a) van die Wet op Natuurlike en Historiese Gedenkwaardig-hede en Oudhede, 1934 (Wet No. 4 van 1934), proklameer ek, Johannes de Klerk, Minister van Nasionale Opvoeding, hierby die Haweraadgebou te Port Elizabeth as 'n gedenk-waardigheid.

BESKRYWING.

Die Haweraadgebou, ook bekend as „The White House”, geleë op die restant van Erf 1762, Port Elizabeth-Sentraal, geleë in die munisipaliteit en afdeling Port Eliza-beth, groot (as sodanig) 3 morg 41 vierkante roede 141·4 vierkante voet.

HISTORIESE BELANG.

Hierdie gebou word vanweë sy uitnemende argitektuur geproklameer. Dit is in 1904 gebou en is 'n uitstekende voorbeeld van die sogenaamde *Art Nouveau* in argitektuur.

BESKRYWING.

Sekere stuk grond met die baken en monument daarop, synde 'n monumentterrein op gedeelte van Erf 1, Bathurst, geleë in die munisipaliteit Bathurst, administratiewe distrik Bathurst, provinsie die Kaap die Goeie Hoop, groot 11·5779 morg (kaart vir proklameringsdoeleindes 1588/68), 'n ongeregistreerde onderverdeling van die restant van die dorpsmeent van Bathurst, afdeling Bathurst (tans bekend as die restant van Erf 1, Bathurst), groot (as sodanig), 3379·2919 morg.

HISTORIESE BELANG.

Op hierdie terrein het kolonel Jacob Cuyler se kamp gestaan toe hy toesig gehou het oor die vestiging van die 1820-setlaars op hulle standplase en die goewerneur Sir Rufane Donkin het hier ook sy kamp opgeslaan toe hy die ligging van die dorp Bathurst vasgestel het.

PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 8 (1) (a) of the Natural Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I, Johannes de Klerk, Minister of National Education, hereby proclaim the Harbour Board Building in Port Elizabeth to be a monument.

DESCRIPTION.

The Harbour Board Building, also known as “The White House”, situate on the remainder of Erf 1762, Port Elizabeth Central, situate in the Municipality and Division of Port Elizabeth, measuring (as such) 3 morgen 41 square roods 141·4 square feet.

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

This building is proclaimed on account of its out-standing architecture. It was built in 1904, and is an excellent example of the so-called *Art Nouveau* in architecture.

PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT.

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 8 (1) (a) of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I, Johannes de Klerk, Minister of National Education, hereby proclaim the undermentioned area in Bathurst with the beacon and monument thereto, to be a monument.

DESCRIPTION.

Certain piece of land with the beacon and monument thereon, being a monument area on Part of Erf 1, Bathurst, situate in the Municipality of Bathurst, Administrative District of Bathurst, Province of the Cape of Good Hope, measuring 11·5779 morgen (diagram for proclamation purposes 1588/68), an unregistered subdivision of the remainder of the Bathurst Town Commonage, Division of Bathurst (now known as the remainder of Erf 1, Bathurst), measuring (as such) 3379·2919 morgen.

HISTORICAL INTEREST.

Col. Jacob Cuyler's Camp stood on this site when he supervised the settlement of the 1820 settlers on their allotments. The Governor, Sir Rufane Donkin also pitched his camp here when he determined the site of the town of Bathurst.
