PROCLAMATION OF A MONUMENT

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 8 (1) (a) of the Natural and Historical Monuments, Relics and Antiques Act, 1934 (Act No. 4 of 1934), I, Johannes de Klerk, Minister of National Education, hereby proclaim the Primary School buildings, Groenberg, Wellington, with the site on which it is situated, to be a monument.

*Description*

Certain piece of perpetual quitrent land with the buildings thereon, being part of the place Welbedacht, situated in the division of the Paarl at Groenberg, measuring one morgen (Deed of Transfer 281/1868, dated 25 June 1868).

*Historical Interest*

The school was built in the sixties of the 19th century. C. P. Hoogenhout, who played an important part in the first phase of the Afrikaans Language Movement, was the teacher there from 3 August 1874 until the beginning of the 20th century. Much of his most important work was done there.

PROKLAMERING VAN 'N GEDENKWAARDIGHEID

Kragtens die bevoegdheid my verleen by artikel 8 (1) (a) van die Wet op Natuurlike en Historiese Gedenkwaardighede en Oudhede, 1934 (Wet No. 4 van 1934), proklameer ek, Johannes de Klerk, Minister van Nasionale Opvoeding, hierby die laerskoolgebou, Groenberg, Wellington, met die perseel waarop dit geleë is, as 'n gedenkwaardigheid.

*Beskrywing*

Sekere stuk ewigdurende erfpaggrond met die gebou daarop, synde 'n gedeelte van die plaas „Welbedacht” geleë in die afdeling Paarl by „Groenberg”, groot eer morg (Transportakte 281/1868, gedateer 25 Junie 1868).

*Historiese Belang*

Die skool is in die jare sestig van die 19de eeu opgerig. Hier was C. P. Hoogenhout, wat 'n belangrike rol in die eerste fase van die Afrikaanse Taalbeweging gespeel het van 3 Augustus 1874 tot in die begin van die 20ste eeu die onderwyser en hier is baie van sy belangrikste werk gedoen.
