Nickerk Viljoen, Minister van Nasionale Opvoeding, hierby die historiese Queen's Tavern, geleë te Stamford Hill-weg 16, Durban, tot nasionale gedenkwaardigheid.

Beskrywing

Die historiese Queen's Tavern, geleë op sekere twee stukke grond, synde—

(1) Persel Kolling, Blok G, Dorpsgrond van Durban 1737, geleë in die stad en county Durban, provinsie Natal; en

(2) Onderverdeling A van Perseel Leesan, Blok G, Dorpsgrond van Durban 1737, geleë in die stad en county Durban, provinsie Natal.

Transportakte 1949/1981, gedateer 23 Januarie 1981.

Historiese en argitektoniese belang

Die Queen's Tavern, wat in 1894 as 'n hereklub opgerig is, is een van Durban se paar oorblywende skakels met die koloniale verlede van Natal. Dit is ook die oudste gelisensieerde perseel in die stad. 10/2/1065.

**WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,
No. 28 OF 1969**
**DECLARATION OF THE HISTORIC QUEEN'S
TAVERN, SITUATED AT 16 STAMFORD HILL ROAD,
DURBAN**

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the historic Queen's Tavern, situated at 16 Stamford Hill Road, Durban, to be a national monument.

Description

The historic Queen's Tavern, situate on certain two pieces of land, being—

(1) Lot Kolling, Block G, Townlands of Durban 1737, situate in the City and County of Durban, Province of Natal; and

(2) Sub A of Lot Leesan, Block G, Townlands of Durban 1737, situate in the City and County of Durban, Province of Natal.

Deed of Transfer 1949/1981, dated 23 January 1981.

Historical and architectural interest

The Queen's Tavern, which was built as a gentlemen's club in 1894, is one of Durban's few remaining links with the colonial past of Natal. It is also the oldest licenced premises in the city. 10/2/1065.
