OOK DIE DRIE NORFOLK-DENNEBOME DAAROP,
GELEË IN HUMEWOODWEG, PORT ELIZABETH

Kragtens die bevoegdheid my verleen by artikel 10 (1)
van die Wet op Oorlogsgrafte en Nasionale Gedenkwaar-
dighede, 1969 (Wet 28 van 1969), verklaar ek, Gerrit van
Niekerk Viljoen, Minister van Nasionale Opvoeding,
hierby die eiendom, tesame met die sogenaamde T. S.
Lanherne-gebou asook die drie Norfolk-dennebome daarop,
geleë in Humewoodweg, Port Elizabeth, tot nasionale ge-
denkwaardigheid.

Beskrywing

Die eiendom tesame met die sogenaamde T. S.
Lanherne-gebou en die drie Norfolk-dennebome daarop,
geleë op Erf 488, 'n gedeelte van Erf 351, Humewood, in
die munisipaliteit en afdeling Port Elizabeth en groot 4 925
vierkante meter.

Historiese en argitektoniese belang

Hierdie indrukwekkende Victoriaanse huis is in 1894 vir
mnr. R. H. Hammersley-Heenen, resident-ingenieur en be-
stuurder van die spoorweë, opgerig. Gedurende die Tweede
Wêreldoorlog is dit gebruik as hersteloord vir soldate,
matrose en vlieëniers van wie 1 303 hierbehandel is. In
1960 is dit aan die Munisipaliteit van Port Elizabeth ver-
koop wat die eiendom in 1967 aan die Internasionale Jeug-
hostelvereniging vir akkommodasiedoeleindes verhuur het.
In 1979 het die Vlootkadetkorps die huurkontrak oorge-
neem.

Die majestueuse Norfolk-dennebome langs die gebou is
gekweek van saad wat van die Kanarie-eilande verkry is.

WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,
No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY TOGETHER
WITH THE SO-CALLED T. S. LANHERNE BUILDING
AND THE THREE NORFOLK PINES THEREON,
SITUATED IN HUMEWOOD ROAD, PORT ELIZA-
BETH

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of
the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act
28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of
National Education, hereby declare the property together
with the so-called T. S. Lanherne building and the three
Norfolk pines thereon, situated in Humewood Road, Port
Elizabeth, to be a national monument.

Description

The property together with the so-called T. S. Lanherne
building and the three Norfolk pines thereon, situate on Erf
488, a portion of Erf 351, Humewood, in the Municipality
and Division of Port Elizabeth, in extent 4 925 square
metres.

Deed of Grant 102/60, dated 21 June 1960.

Historical and architectural interest

This impressive Victorian house was erected in 1894 for
Mr R. H. Hammersley-Heenen, resident engineer and gen-
eral manager of the railways. During the Second World War
it served as a convalescent home for soldiers, sailors and
airmen, 1 303 of whom were treated here. In 1960 it was
sold to the Municipality of Port Elizabeth, which in 1967
leased the property to the International Youth Hostel Asso-
ciation for accommodation purposes. In 1979 the Naval
Cadet Corps took over the lease.

The majestic Norfolk pines next to the building were
cultivated from seeds obtained from the Canary Islands.
