DECLARATION OF THE FAÇADES OF THE FOUR DOUBLE-STOREYED SHOP BUILDINGS, SITUATED AT 32–34, 50, 54–56 AND 58–60, HIGH STREET, GRAHAMSTOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I. Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the façades of the four double-storeyed shop buildings, situated at 32-34, 50, 54-56 and 58-60 High Street, Grahamstown, to be national monuments.

## Description

The façades of the four double-storeyed shop buildings, situated as follows:

- (a) 32-34, High Street, Grahamstown:
- (i) Certain piece of land, being the Remaining Extent of part of Lot 8 (now known as the Remainder of Erf 3903, Grahamstown), situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany; and
- (ii) certain piece of land, being portion of part of Erf 8 (now known as Erf 3904, Grahamstown), situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany.

Deed of Transfer 1926/1958, dated 18 February 1958 (paragraphs 1 and 2).

- (b) 50 High Street, Grahamstown:
- (i) Certain land situate in the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being Erf 3886, Grahamstown; and
- (ii) certain land situate in the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being the Remainder of Erf 3882, Grahamstown.

Deed of Transfer 22403/1981, dated 22 May 1981.

(c) 54-56 High Street, Grahamstown:

Certain land situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being Erf 3880, Grahamstown.

Deed of Transfer 23812/1971, dated 9 September 1971.

(d) 58-60 High Street, Grahamstown:

Certain land situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being the Remainder of Erf 3879, Grahamstown.

Deed of Transfer 23811/1971, dated 9 September 1971.

## Historical and architectural interest

These late nineteenth century shops, with their Neo-Renaissance façades, form an integral part of the architectural character of High Street, and are an important element in the historical city centre of Grahamstown. 10/2/1058.
