

WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT.
No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE TWO PROPERTIES TOGETHER WITH THE VICTORIAN DOUBLE-STO-REYED SEMI-DETACHED HOUSES THEREON, SI-TUATED AT 7 ALBERT ROAD AND 10 GROVE ROAD, MOWBRAY

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the two properties together with the Victorian double-storeyed semi-detached houses thereon, situated at 7 Albert Road and 10 Grove Road, Mowbray, to be national monuments.

Description

The two properties together with the Victorian double-storeyed semi-detached houses thereon, described as follows:

(a) *7 Albert Road, Mowbray:*

Certain piece of land situate in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being Erf 28601, Cape Town at Mowbray, in extent one hundred and ninety-six (196) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 18474/1980, dated 12 June 1980.

(b) *10 Grove Road, Mowbray:*

Erf 28609, Cape Town at Mowbray, in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, in extent one hundred and ninety-four (194) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 51893/1983, dated 17 November 1983.

Historical and architectural interest

These two properties form an integral part of a unique block consisting of two terraced rows of identical late Victorian double-storeyed semi-detached houses that date from the 1880s and that have magnificent cast-iron verandahs and balconies. The first and last houses in Albert Road have ornate triangular pedimented gables with cartouches, while the other buildings are without gables. 10/2/1115.
