

WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,
No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE FAÇADES OF THE TWO
DOUBLE-STOREYED SEMI-DETACHED SHOP
BUILDINGS, SITUATED AT 36 AND 46-48 HIGH
STREET, GRAHAMSTOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the façades of the two double-storeyed semi-detached shop buildings, situated at 36 and 46-48 High Street, Grahamstown, to be national monuments.

Description

The façades of the two double-storeyed semi-detached shop buildings, situated on the following erven:

36 High Street, Grahamstown:

Certain piece of land, situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany, being Erf 3902, Grahamstown.

Deed of Transfer 5108/1981, dated 10 February 1982.

46-48 High Street, Grahamstown:

(i) Certain piece of land, being Erf 3888, Grahamstown, situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany; and

(ii) certain piece of land, being Erf 3887, Grahamstown, situate in the Municipality of the City of Grahamstown, Division of Albany.

Deed of Transfer T28876/1981, dated 9 July 1981.

Historical and architectural interest

These two buildings form an integral part of a unique row of semi-detached double-storeyed shops whose façades feature a combination of Free Renaissance, neo-Classical and Georgian styles, blending to form a harmonious architectural feature in High Street, which contains a unique collection of late-nineteenth century residential and commercial buildings. 10/2/1132.
