DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH THE DOU-BLE-STOREYED VICTORIAN DWELLING-HOUSE THEREON, SITUATED AT 15 BELVEDERE AVENUE, ORANJEZICHT, CAPE TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Gerrit van Niekerk Viljoen, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the doublestoreyed Victorian dwelling-house thereon, situated at 15 Belvedere Avenue, Oranjezicht, Cape Town, to be a national monument.

Description

The property, together with the double-storeyed house thereon, situate on certain piece of land in Gardens, Cape Town, in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being Erf 544, Oranjezicht, in extent four hundred and seventy-one (471) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 11144/1971, dated 30 April 1971.

Historical and architectural interest

This imposing dwelling with its late-Victorian features was erected at the turn of the century. It is one of the earliest dwellings to be erected in Belvedere Avenue, which is itself an architecturally important area in the suburb of Oranjezicht. RNG 10/2/1156.
