

**WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,
No. 28 OF 1969****DECLARATION OF THE CONSOLIDATED FARM 1341
(FORMERLY KNOWN AS THE FARMS ROGGELAND,
NON PAREILLE AND GOEDE RUST), SITUATED AT
DAL JOSAFAT, IN THE DISTRICT OF PAARL, INCLU-
SIVE OF ALL THE HISTORIC BUILDINGS THEREON**

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Pierre Cronjé, Deputy Minister of National Education, hereby declare the Consolidated Farm 1341 (formerly known as the farms Roggeland, Non Pareille and Goede Rust), situated at Dal Josafat, in the District of Paarl, inclusive of all the historic buildings thereon, to be a national monument.

Description

Certain piece of partly abolished quitrent and partly freehold land with all the buildings thereon, being the Farm 1341 (formerly known as the farms Roggeland, Non Pareille and Goede Rust), situate in the Administrative District of Paarl, in extent 232,5850 (two hundred and thirty-two comma five eight five nought) hectares.

Certificate of Consolidated Title T. 45186/1981, dated 16 October 1981.

Historical and architectural interest

The farms Non Pareille and Goede Rust were originally granted in 1690 and Roggeland in 1693. These farms were for centuries in the hands of the French Huguenots and their descendants. There are approximately 14 historic buildings in the Cape Dutch or Victorian Style, the most important of which have already been restored by the National Monuments Council. The Hugo cemetery on Non Pareille is also of cultural history interest. 10/2/633.
