

WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,
No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE MOWBRAY TOWN HALL,
SITUATED IN MAIN ROAD, MOWBRAY, CAPE TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Pierre Cronjé, Deputy Minister of National Education, hereby declare the entire exterior of the Mowbray Town Hall, including the external walls and windows, the roof, the bell-cupola, the entrance steps and the iron gates, situated on Erven 28520 and 28513 in Main Road, Mowbray, Cape Town, to be a national monument.

Description

The entire exterior of the Mowbray Town Hall, including the external walls and windows, the roof, the bell-cupola, the entrance steps and the iron gates, situated on the following erven:

(i) certain lot of land situated in the Cape District of Driekoppen, being part of Lot 2 (now known as Remainder of Erf 28513, Cape Town at Mowbray).

Deed of Transfer 74/1847, dated 12 April 1847.

(ii) Certain piece of land situate at Mowbray in the Cape Division (now known as Erf 28520, Cape Town at Mowbray).

Deed of Transfer 116/1893, dated 12 January 1893.

Historical and architectural interest

This impressive town hall with its Flemish Renaissance features was designed by the architect J. C. Tully of Tully and Waters and erected in 1900. 10/2/1192.
