

WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT,  
No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY WITH THE SO-  
CALLED ZORGWYK HOUSE THEREON, SITUATED  
AT 36 BREDA STREET, GARDENS, CAPE TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Pierre Cronjé, Deputy Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property with the so-called Zorgwyk House thereon, situated at 36 Breda Street, Gardens, Cape Town, to be a national monument.

*Description*

The property with the so-called Zorgwyk House thereon, described as certain piece of land, situate in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being Erf 504, Oranjezicht, in extent two hundred and sixty-four (246) square metres.

Deed of Transfer T20897/1982, dated 11 June 1982.

*Historical and architectural interest*

This house, which was built predominantly in the Georgian style, was originally the homestead of the loan farm Zorgwyk. The house, which is indicated on a map of 1820, is one of but a few of the homesteads of the early loan farms in the Upper Table Valley that have survived.
