DECLARATION OF THE PROPERTY INCLUSIVE OF THE EDWARDIAN DOUBLE-STOREYED MANOR-HOUSE THEREON, SITUATED AT 21 BELVEDERE AVENUE, ORANJEZICHT, CAPE TOWN

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969). I, Frederik Willem de Klerk, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the property inclusive of the Edwardian double-storeyed manor-house thereon, situated at 21 Belvedere Avenue, Oranjezicht, Cape Town, to be a national monument.

## Description

The property inclusive of the Edwardian double-storeyed manor-house thereon, described as certain piece of land situated in the City of Cape Town, Cape Division, being Erf 550, Oranjezicht, in extent one thousand eight hundred and thirty-four (1 834) square metres.

## Historical and architectural interest

This impressive double-storeyed manor-house, which was erected shortly after the turn of the century, is an excellent example of Edwardian architecture, and has neoclassical and Victorian features.
