WAR GRAVES AND NATIONAL MONUMENTS ACT, No. 28 OF 1969

DECLARATION OF THE THREE DOUBLE-STOR-EYED TERRACED HOUSES SITUATED AT 46, 48 AND 56 BARNET STREET, GARDENS, CAPE TOWN, INCLUSIVE OF THE ERVEN ON WHICH THEY STAND

By virtue of the powers vested in me by section 10 (1) of the War Graves and National Monuments Act, 1969 (Act 28 of 1969), I, Frederik Willem de Klerk, Minister of National Education, hereby declare the three double-storeyed terraced houses situated at 46, 48 and 56 Barnet Street, Gardens, Cape Town, inclusive of the erven on which they stand, to be national monuments.

Description

The three double-storeyed terraced houses, inclusive of the erven on which they stand, namely:

(a) 46 Barnet Street, Gardens:

Erf 96206, a portion of Erf 95486, Cape Town, at Gardens, in the Municipality of Cape Town, Cape Division, in extent one hundred and forty-eight (148) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 60317/1983, dated 28 December 1983.

(b) 48 Barnet Street, Gardens:

Erf 96205, a portion of Erf 95486, Cape Town, at Gardens, in the Municipality of Cape Town, Cape Division, in extent one hundred and forty (140) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 7368/1984, dated 9 February 1984

(c) 56 Barnet Street, Gardens:

Erf 96201, a portion of Erf 95486 Cape Town, at Gardens, in the Municipality of Cape Town, Cape Division, in extent one hundred and forty-six (146) square metres.

Deed of Transfer 60314/1983, dated 28 December 1983.

Historical and architectural interest

These three double-storeyed houses form an integral part of a row of six similar late-nineteenth-century terraced houses with Georgian and Victorian features.
