







Aerial view of Farms 956/rem, 1274 and 1419 (red polygons) showing their immediate context.




Aerial view of the study area showing the proposed consolidation (red shading (note narrow strip connecting the two larger areas) and the location of the proposed fence (green line).





Extract from the SAHRIS Palaeosensitivity map showing the study area (red polygon) to be of low palaeontological sensitivity (blue shading).




