OCTOBER 2005 PROGRESS REPORT: PERMITS TO DESTROY ARCHAEOLOGICAL MATERIAL (NO. 80/04/08/022/51, 80/04/08/023/51 & 80/04/08/024/51)

In September 2004 the South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA) issued me with permits no. 80/04/08/022/51, 80/04/08/023/51 and 80/04/08/024/51 for the destruction of archaeological material, provisionally ascribed to the Doornfontein Industry, for dating purposes. Obtaining these dates forms part of my doctoral research project (as briefly discussed in the accompanying report on the excavation at Vlermuisgat), conducted in the Department of Archaeology, University of Cambridge, under the supervision of Prof David Phillipson.

Samples submitted

The following samples from lower units of the sites Bokvasmaak 3, Biesje Poort 2 and Melkboom 1 were selected in consultation with Mr David Morris of the McGregor Museum, in terms of the abovementioned permit, and submitted for conventional radiocarbon dating at the *Quaternary Dating Unit* (QUADRU), CSIR:
