

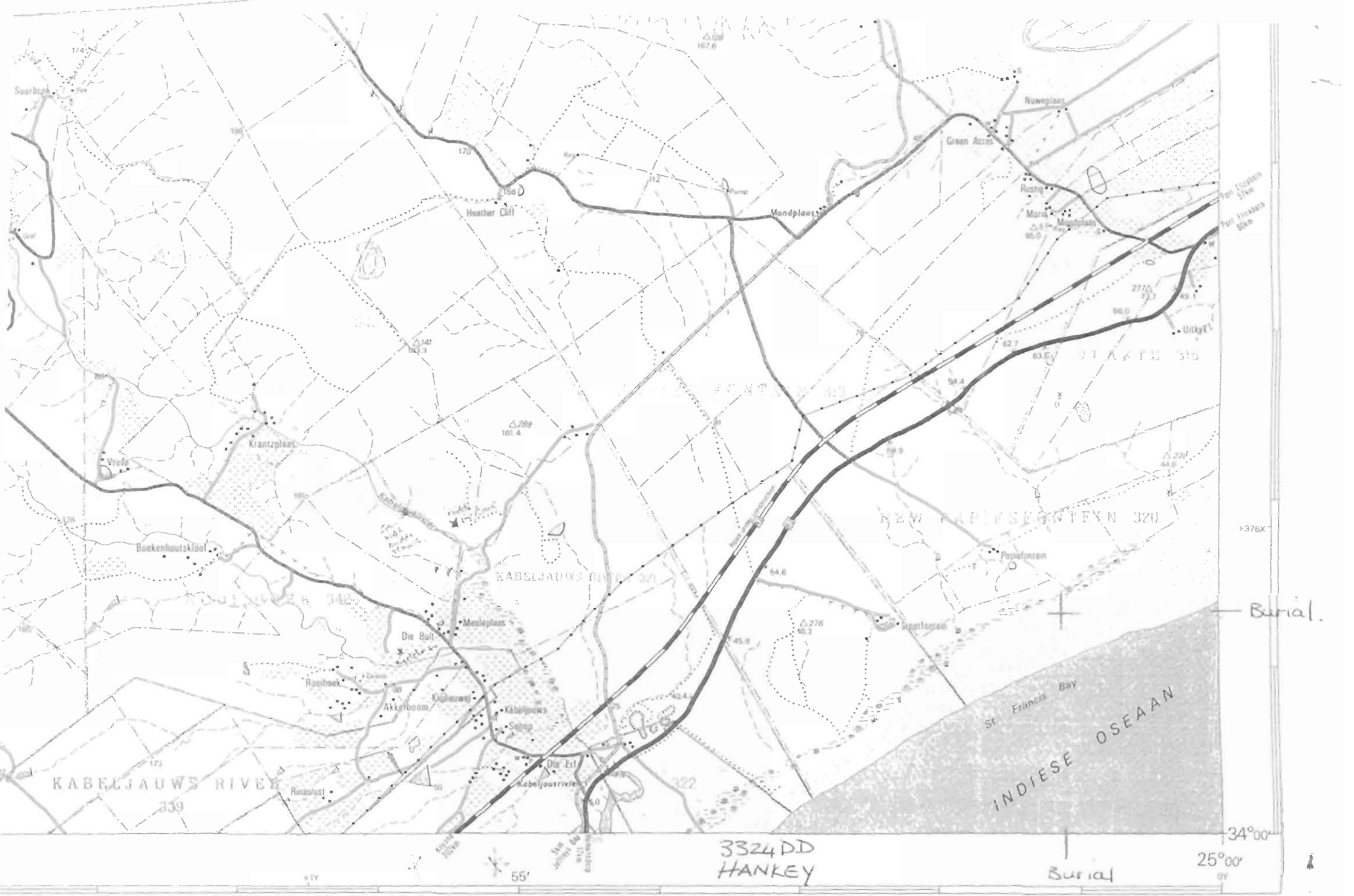

**RESCUE EXCAVATION OF A PARTIAL BURIAL, PART OF WHICH WAS
REMOVED AND COLLECTED BY THE POLICE IN THE DUNEFIELD**

On 9 November 2005 Mr Kobus Reichert, who discovered the skeleton, accompanied Dr Johan Binneman to the burial site in the dunes on the farm New Papiestfontein 320 (33.58.38S; 24.58.50E). The dune sand of the burial site and immediate surrounds were sieved to collect possible small bones that were missed or not collected when the skeleton was removed by members of the South African Police Services. Only a few small bones were found. These were delivered to the South African Police Station in Humansdorp and presumably placed with the rest of the remains from where they were sent to Cape Town to be studied. The remains are still in Cape Town.
