3. THE SITE

The study site for the proposed development is illustrated in Figure 1.

The property is located within a developing area designated for urban development.




Figure 2. Phase 1 Archaeological impact Asses De Bron Road, Brackenfell. The site looking east. 1 Archaeological Impact Assessment, proposed development,




Figure 3. Phase 1 Archaeological Impact Assessment, proposed development, De Bron Road, Brackenfell. The site looking west.

The property is currently undeveloped, and is in a disturbed and altered state (Figures 2 & 3). The site is infested with weeds and grass. Dune mole rat activity is fairly extensive across the site

4. STUDY APPROACH

The approach used in the AIA entailed a detailed ground survey of the property.

No archaeological remains were located on the site.
