### **ARCHAEOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT LENTEJEUR HOSPITAL COMPLEX TRANSPORT PROJECT: CONSTRUCTION OF ACCESS ROADS AT MANDALAY STATION**

I visited the site on 25 September 2003 and searched the area for archaeological remains (Figure 1).

A detailed foot survey of the proposed access roads at Mandalay Station was undertaken.

No archaeological remains were noted during the assessment of the site, and the proposed access roads at Mandalay Station.

No old buildings, structures or features were noted on the property.

The site is severely degraded, comprising dense stands of alien vegetation and open veld, within a rapidly developing urban area. Some illegal dumping and sand mining was also noted. A number of footpaths and tracks cut across the site. Some current building and earthworks were noted alongside the Mandalay railway line.


The probability of locating any significant archaeological remains during implementation of the project is likely to be very low.

The affected environment is not considered to be archaeologically sensitive, threatened or vulnerable.

With regard to the proposed Lentegueur Hospital Complex Transport Project: construction of access roads at Mandalay Station, the following recommendations are made.

- No archaeological mitigation is required.
- No further detailed studies are required.
- The project should be allowed to proceed as planned.
