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CULTURAL HERITAGE RESOURCES IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF NEW K 1,2 & 3 PIPELINE GROENKLOOF PRETORIA GAUTENG

1. **DEFINITION**

The broad generic term *Cultural Heritage Resources* refers to any physical and spiritual property associated with past and present human use or occupation of the environment, cultural activities and history. The term includes sites, structures, places, natural features and material of palaeontological, archaeological, historical, aesthetic, scientific, architectural, religious, symbolic or traditional importance to specific individuals or groups, traditional systems of cultural practice, belief or social interaction.

2. PROTECTED SITES IN TERMS OF THE NATIONAL HERITAGE RESOURCES ACT, ACT NO. 25 OF 1999

The following are the most important sites and objects protected by the National Heritage Act:

- 2.1 Structures or parts of structures older than 60 years.
- 2.2 Archaeological sites and objects.
- 2.3 Palaeontological sites.
- 2.4 Meteorites.
- 2.5 Ship wrecks.
- 2.6 Burial grounds.
- 2.7 Graves of victims of conflict.
- 2.8 Public monuments and memorials.
- 2.9 Structures, places and objects protected through the publication of notices in the Gazette and Provincial Gazette.
- 2.10 Any other places or object, which are considered to be of interest or of historical or cultural significance.
- 2.11 Geological sites of scientific or cultural importance.
- 2.12 Sites of significance relating to the history of slavery in South Africa.
- 2.13 Objects to which oral traditions are attached.
- 2.14 Sites of cultural significance or other value to a community or pattern of South African history.

3. METHODOLOGY

The site was visited and inspected on foot. All appropriate documents on the area were studied.

4. RESULTS

The proposed KK 1,2 & 3 water pipeline will run north from the Klapperkop reservoirs to the southern boarder of the Groenkloof township and the northwest to cross George Storrer Road. From here it will run parallel to George Storrer Road in a western direction. This area original was the Kirkness Brick Quarry, later a rubbish dump and today it is the Pretoria Teaches Training College. Near an area just west of the Unisa Building it will cross the R21 to join up with existing pipelines.

No indications of any important cultural heritage resources could be found on the pipelines route through the Groenkloof Nature Reserve, the Teachers Training College grounds and the short section in the Fountains Valley

5. CONCLUSION

There are no cultural heritage resources present on the route of the KK 1,2 & 3 water pipeline.

6. RECOMMENDATION

There is no objection to the proposed construction of the KK 1,2 &3 pipeline from a cultural heritage resources point of view.
