ARCHAEOLOGICAL INVESTIGATION: RANDJIESPARK

As requested, we have investigated the site that is considered for development in Randjiespark X4, Midrand, Gauteng Province.

The site is bordered on the north by Medical Street and on the south by New Road. The eastern and wester sides contain light industrial development.

The site contain some natural grass vegetation and kikuyu grass. A few trees occur. Below two of these clumps of trees, features that resemble (duck)ponds, occur, although they are very overgrown and difficult to identify.

However, no sites, features or artifacts of cultural significance were identified on the site and it is recommended that development can continue. It should be kept in mind that archaeological sites tend to occur below the ground. If, during construction, anything is opened up, this should be reported in order that it can be investigated further.
