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CULTURAL HERITAGE RESOURCES IMPACT ASSESSMENT OF AGRICULTURAL HOLDING 127 RASLOUW CENTURION GAUTENG

1. **DEFINITION**

The broad generic term Cultural Heritage Resources refers to any physical and spiritual property associated with past and present human use or occupation of the environment, cultural activities and history. The term includes sites, structures, places, natural features and material of palaeontological, archaeological, historical, aesthetic, scientific, architectural, religious, symbolic or traditional importance to specific individuals or groups, traditional systems of cultural practice, belief or social interaction.

- 2.13 Objects to which oral traditions are attached.
- 2.14 Sites of cultural significance or other value to a community or pattern of South African history.

The proposed development area is a well-developed agricultural holding with a large 1980s house and outbuildings and a large garden. There are also two water reservoirs on the site. The servant's quarters are two prefab buildings dating to the 1990s.

There are no archaeological sites or artefacts on the site. There are also no historic structures older than sixty years of graves on the property.

There are no important cultural heritage resources on the proposed development site.
