## SUMMARY

The National Cultural History Museum was contracted by Montedi, on behalf of Aquarius Platinum (S.A.)(Pty)Ltd., to exhume and relocate 23 graves located on the farm Kafferskraal 342 JQ , near Marikana in the Rustenburg District. New developments for the Marikana Platinum Mine are to be undertaken in this area, and these graves, most older than 60 years, will be directly impacted upon by these developments.

Two of the graves were younger than 60 years old, and were exhumed by Avibob staff, although the NCHM Archaeologists also undertook the full documentation of these remains. These two burials were also the only ones where it was possible to trace relatives, and these two burials were exhumed with family members present. All the burials were reinterred nearby in a new cemetery developed up by the mine.

Detailed photographic documentation of each grave and burial was conducted, while the remains were also measured and examined by the archaeologists before removal. A map of the site and each grave was also drawn and the site indicated on a 1:50 000 map of the area.

AIMS
The aims of the archaeological exhumation of the 23 burials on the site was the following:
(a) to identify and locate all possible human remains contained in these burials to facilitate their complete and successful relocation
(b) detailed and complete documentation of the graves, burials and their contents, using archaeological methodology and standard museum practise

We were informed by the client about the extent of the area that will be affected by the proposed development. They also indicated the position of each grave that had to be exhumed and relocated. The work was to be confined to this area.

## LEGISLATIVE REQUIREMENTS

Aspects concerning the conservation of cultural resources are mainly dealt with in two acts. These are the South African Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999) and the Environmental Conservation Act (Act 73 of 1989).

South African Heritage Resources Act

## Archaeology, palaeontology and meteorites

Section 35(4) of this act states that no person may, without a permit issued by the responsible heritage resources authority:
(a) destroy, damage, excavate, alter, deface or otherwise disturb any archaeological or palaeontological site or any meteorite;
(b) destroy, damage, excavate, remove from its original position, collect or own any archaeological or palaeontological material or object or any meteorite;
(c) trade in, sell for private gain, export or attempt to export from the Republic any category of archaeological or palaeontological material or object, or any meteorite; or
(d) bring onto or use at an archaeological or palaeontological site any excavation equipment or any equipment which assists in the detection or recovery of metals or archaeological and palaeontological material or objects, or use such equipment for the recovery of meteorites.
(e) alter or demolish any structure or part of a structure which is older than 60 years as protected.

The above mentioned may only be disturbed or moved by an archaeologist, after receiving a permit from the South African Heritage Resources Agency.

Human remains:

## Human remains:

In terms of Section 36(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, no person may, without a permit issued by the relevant heritage resources authority: (a) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position of otherwise disturb the grave of a victim of conflict, or any burial ground or part thereof which contains such graves;
(b) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb any grave or burial ground older than 60 years which is situated outside a formal cemetery administered by a local authority; or
(c) bring onto or use at a burial ground or grave referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) any excavation, or any equipment which assists in the detection or recovery of metals.

Human remains that are less than 60 years old is subject to provisions of the Human Tissue Act (Act 65 of 1983) and to local regulations.

Exhumation of graves must conform to the standards set out in the Ordinance on Excavations (Ordinance no. 12 of 1980) (replacing the old Transvaal Ordinance no. 7 of 1925). Permission must also be gained from the descendants (where known), the National Department of Health, Provincial Department of Health, Premier of the Province and local police. Furthermore, permission must also be gained from the various landowners (ie where the graves are located and where they are to be relocated) before exhumation can take place.

Human remains can only be handled by a registered undertaker or an institution declared under the Human Tissues Act (Act 65 of 1983 as amended).

## Environmental Conservation Act

This act states that a survey and an evaluation of culfural resources should be undertaken in areas where development, which will change the face of the environment, is to be made. The impact of the development on the cultural resources should also be determined and proposals to mitigate this impact is to be formulated.

## METHODOLOGY

## Exhumation and relocation

After detailed documentation, each grave was opened by Avbob staff up to the level of the burial, or when the first bone material was encountered. The archaeologists then opened up the remains carefully using required excavation equipment, before detailed documentation commenced. After documentation, the remains were removed and placed in new coffins supplied by Avbob, and taken to the new cemetery for reinternment.

## Documentation

The documentation comprised the following:
Photographic - Photo's of the site prior to exhumation, as well as of each grave was taken. Each burial, with its contents in situ, was also
photographically documented.
GPS Data - A GPS reading for the site was taken in order to locate it on the 1:50 000 map of the area, while one was also taken at the new cemetery were the burials were relocated to (See Appendix 2).

Mapping - A dumpy level and staff was used to map the site parameters and each individual grave located on the site. A site map was then drawn to indicate the position of each grave on the site and in relation to each other (See Appendix 3).

Burial Recording Forms - These forms were used to record all details of each grave and burial, such as dimensions, position, contents, preservation of remains, cultural material found and all other observations regarding the skeletal remains (See Appendix 1 for forms).

## DESCRIPTION OF THE AREA

The site is located on the farm Kafferskkraal 342 JQ near Marikana in the Rustenburg district. It lies between $25^{\circ} 43^{\prime} 55.2^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{S}$ and $27^{\circ} 26^{\prime} 55.7^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{E}$ (Appendix 2). The graves are located in a fairly densely covered tree and shrub area, near old ploughed fields. Remnants of an old barbed wire fence indicates the old cemetery. The new cemetery is also located on Kafferskraal, between $25^{\circ} 44^{\prime} 19^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{S}$ and $27^{\circ} 27^{\prime} 59.1^{\prime \prime} \mathrm{E}$.

## DISCUSSION

A total of 23 graves had to be exhumed and relocated. It was only possible to trace 1 family, descendants of two brothers buried at the site. These two individuals were buried in Burial 1 \& 2 (actually llarge grave), in 1948 and 1970 respectively. As these two were therefore less than 60 years old, they were deemed to fall outside our jurisdiction, and Avbob removed and reburied them. We did however do the documentation of theses two burials as well (See Burial recording forms).

Only one of the graves had a formal headstone with an inscription. This inscription read Joel Matsi Koane 17.8.1934, and is probably a good indication of the age of the rest of the burials. Only one burial, No. 11, had nor remains whatsoever, and in hindsight was not a grave at all. Burial 13 contained no skeletal remains, and only some rusted coffin nails, and presumably contained a young child or infant. All the other graves produced remains, most excellently preserved, and included 10 children and/or infants, 3 female adults and 9 males. Grave goods were scarce, allthough some nails and pieces of coffin wood was recovered from most. Other grave goods include mother-of-pearl buttons, safety-pins, a tie-pin, and a beltbuckle. One individual, probably female, had a earring, two small blue glass beads and a copper bracellette around the arm, while in one burial a 1943 one shilling was recovered.

Regarding physicasl condition of the skeletal remains, most were well preserved and nearly complete, although the child and infant remains tended to be far less complete. A bullet hole and chop mark was observed in the skull of one of theindividuals (the shilling in his right hand), while the telltale signs of syphillis were observed on the remains of one adult male (Burial 23). Large tree roots, clay soil and rain made the exhumation difficult and time-consuming. Even so, all skeletal and other remains were successfully
removed and reburied.
For full details on all 23 burials see Appendix I - Burial Recording Forms.

## CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

To conclude it is possible to say that most of the 23 burials are beyond 60 years old, except the two noted earlier (Burial 1 \& 2). Most of these were probably farm labourers and their family members. The single headstone with inscription puts the relative age of the other burials to around the mid 1930's and early 1940's. However, an older age for some can not be excluded. To conclude, the exhumation and relocation of these graves were therefore completed successfully and professionally.

The only recommendation is that should more graves or human remains, or forthat matter any cultural (archaeological/historical) material, be uncovered during mining operations in this area, work be ceased until proper investigation by archaeologists had taken place.
