# Archaeology-Heritage Impact Assessment – Alternative Routes for the Swellendam Link Road

## **Executive Summary**

Two alternative routes for the eastern access link road connecting to the N2 in Swellendam were accessed. The most easterly route, alternative 1, is the preferred route because it is further from the historic core of the town. This route runs past a formal cemetery but will not negatively impact on it. The other route, alternative 2, follows a line that is close to the historic core and this is assessed as a strongly negative feature. It is recommended that the alternative route 1 be used to upgrade the eastern access between the town and the N2.

## **Background information on the routes**

**Route 1**, the preferred route (Fig. 2), follows an existing road for most of its path. The initial short section will be a new road across what has been cultivated land and will not be a negative factor. The route skirts a fenced-off formal cemetery but will not endanger it.

**Route 2**, the second alternative route (Fig. 3), starts close to the historic core of Swellendam that includes important buildings and is a focus for tourism. This route is not preferred for that reason. Heritage conservation is based on minimising and avoiding impacts on significant resources and this would include directing traffic away from such resources. Route 2 would also entail construction of a greater length of new road in contrast to Route 1.

#### **Observations**

The only archaeological material observed was a Later Stone Age silcrete core in the surface drift of a plough line between and near the start of the two routes. The significance is rated as low because no clustering of materials that would constitute a site was observed. There is no indication of preserved palaeontological materials.

#### **Sources of Risk**

The proximity of the less preferred alternative Route 2 to the historically significant core increases risks of impacts on heritage resources in construction. Route 1 poses a lower risk.

## **Recommended Mitigations**

It is recommended that Route 1 be preferred over the alternative Route 2.
