INTRODUCTION

Umlando was contracted by Exigent Environmental to undertake an archaeological survey of a proposed development at the Zululand Chamber of Business Park Foundation (ZCBF) Park. The reference is DC28/0020/08.

The Zululand Motor Club proposes to construct a 1200m by 8 m wide motor race track on land made available by the ZCBF. This track will facilitate motor bike, motor cross and go-cart events. A grand stand to accommodate 200 spectators, as well as additional spectator areas, ablution and secure areas will also be part of the proposed development.

The affected area are currently has blue gum trees, a canal, Eskom servitudes, and general earth disturbances. The vegetation was relatively dense resulting in low archaeological visibility. To counter this I surveyed the various tracks and disturbed areas for archaeological remains.

No archaeological remains were observed in the area. No further management is required for this area.
