

LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION FOR EXEMPTION

FOR Proposed Upgrade of the Thabazimbi Waste Water Treatment Works

Introduction

The study area is situated within the Waterberg district and forms part of the existing Waste Water Treatment Works. The site is situated approximately 2.5 km south-west of Thabazimbi town in the Limpopo Province and is situated on Portion 5 of the farm Donkerhoek 344 KQ. The Rooikuilspruit runs adjacent to the facility.

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Proposed Development

The proposed upgrade comprises:

- Extending the existing works to cater for a 6.5Ml/day demand
- Retaining of the trickling filter
- Installation of additional clarifiers and associated flow distribution
- Construction of a berm to protect the works against flooding

Evaluation

All the proposed additions and alterations to the treatment works will be in the existing footprint of the plant. The area has been severely disturbed and subjected to sporadic flooding due to the Rooikuilspruit overflowing its banks.

No historical or archaeological settlements, structures, features or artefacts were recorded during the site visit, which was conducted on 12 February 2009. None of the existing buildings that form part of the plant are older than 60 years or hold heritage value.




Figure 1: General view of the facility.

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


Figure 3: Main building at the plant.




Figure 4: Building used by employees.
