Please note: Permit Applications expire one year after the date of receipt.

In terms of Section 36 (3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act No. 25 of 1999) no person may, without a permit issued by the relevant heritage resources authority:

(a) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb the grave of a victim of conflict, or any burial ground or part thereof which contains such graves;

(b) destroy, damage, alter, exhume or remove from its original position or otherwise disturb any grave or burial ground older than 60 years which is situated outside a formal cemetery administered by a local authority; or

(c) bring onto or use at a burial ground or grave referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) any excavation equipment, or any equipment which assists in the detection or recovery of metals.

Other application forms are available for archaeological and palaeontological material and sites (302), for shipwrecks (303), for the export or sale of heritage objects including archaeological and palaeontological material, material from shipwrecks and meteorites (304),

for the built environment and landscape (307) or the registration of private collections (402).

Applicants are advised that without full details no permit may be issued.



Public Participation Process was conducted with the aim of finding the relatives of the said graves. This includes newspaper advertisement; placing of site notices; community meetings; distribution of Background Information Documents (BIDs) and radio announcements. The newspaper advertisement was published by the Brakpan Herald under the classifieds on Friday 05 March 2021. The site notices were placed around Labore, Geluksdal and Tsakane. Background Information Documents (BIDs) written in both English and IsiZulu were circulated by the Community Liaison Officer (CLO) Fortunate Masilela, who also assisted in circulating a voice note on the WhatsApp community group. The same voice notes which were both in English and SiSwati/IsiZulu were broadcasted on EKFM 103.6 (Community Radio Station) from 10 April 2021 – 14 April 2021 under different time slots in five South African official languages IsiZulu, SiSwati, IsiXhosa, SeSotho and English. Two community meetings were held at Faranani Site Hall under Covid 19 restrictions. One on 07 April 2021 where attendance was not satisfactory; and another attempt on 14 April 2021. Community members had no knowledge of the graves under study nor assist is locating their relatives.

PAYMENT may be made by depositing the relevant amount into the SAHRA bank account and faxing or producing the proof of payment (i.e., stamped deposit slip, internet banking confirmation, etc.), OR through Internet Banking and emailing or faxing proof of payment, OR by cheque, on application.
