Exemption of a Phase 1 Heritage Impact Assessment for a proposed new township establishment on the farm Avonmore no. 1951, Bainsvlei, Bloemfontein, FS Province.

Site: Farm Avonmore no. 1951

District: Bloemfontein

Map Ref.: 2926AA Bloemfontein





Figure 1. Map of Avonmore 1951 (Portion of 1:50 000 scale topographic map 2926 AA Bloemfontein).






Figure 3 The SAHRIS palaeosensitivity map (top) indicate that Avonmore 1951 is located within an outcrop area of the palaeontologically significant Adelaide Subgroup, *Pa* (below; portion of 1;250 000 scale geological map Bloemfontein 2926).




Figure 6. Aerial view with historical topographic maps ca. 1948 (top right) and 1951 (bottom left) of the area.




Figure 7. The 1918 Transfer Deed for Avonmore 1951.

The establishment of a new residential development on the farm Avonmore 1951, is planned on an 8 ha area of land, located about 5km northwest of Bloemfontein, and next to the R64 provincial road bound for Dealesville (Fig. 1 & 2; Table 1). Underlying geology at the site consist of potentially fossil-bearing Beaufort Group (Adelaide Subgroup) strata (Pa) capped by well-developed residual soils and Quaternary wind-blown sands to the south and palaeontologically sterile dolerite outcrop (Jd) to the north (Fig. 3). A brief foot survey of the area indicates that the superficial overburden has been degraded by recent agricultural and construction activities (Fig. 4 & 5). Historical maps of the area dating back to as recent as 1951 show no evidence of buildings, homesteads or associated structures on the property (Fig. 6 & 7).

Potential archaeological impact within the proposed development area is considered to be non-existent. The likelihood of palaeontological impact on bedrock sedimentary strata and overlying superficial overburden is considered to be low to extremely low, respectively.

It is recommended that the proposed development is exempt from a Phase 1 Heritage Impact Assessment, but with the proviso that potential exposure of fresh / unweathered sedimentary bedrock that may result from, for example, digging of > 1 meter deep trench excavations during the construction phase of the development, is monitored for in situ fossil material..
