

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Relocation of Remains from Twenty Four Graves Located on Portion 43 of the Farm Mooifontein 14-Ir, Kempton Park, Gauteng.

This report is submitted in fulfilment of the requirements of:

- ❑ The **South African Heritage Resources Agency Permit No. BG/12/10/002/87**, issued under Section 36(3) of the National Heritage Resources Act, Act no. 25 of 1999 to H. Steyn and C. Nienaber.
- ❑ The agreement between *PGS Heritage* and *Noelene Enterprises* for the completion of the Chlookop Grave Relocation project.

PGS Heritage was appointed by Noelene Enterprises to undertake the relocation of 23 graves (the number initially identified) on Portion 43 of the Farm Mooifontein 14-IR, Kempton Park, Gauteng, that would be negatively affected by the implementation of development activities on that property.

This report documents the relocation of remains from the identified graves (as required by SAHRA in terms of section 36 of the National Heritage Resources Act, 25 of 1999), implemented under the SAHRA Permit No. BG/12/10/002/87, issued by the SAHRA Burial Grounds and Graves Unit.

During the relocation process, the human remains of 24 individuals were relocated from Portion 43 of the Farm Mooifontein 14-IR, Kempton Park, Gauteng, on 21 February 2013.

- From 23 graves counted, one proved to be not a grave (CHL 013) and one contained the remains of three individuals (CHK 017A, 017B, 017C). Therefore, in total the remains of 24 individuals were exhumed and relocated.
- Of the 24 individuals one was claimed by family relatives.
- Of the 24 individuals, 13 were small children. Of the 11 adults four had marked headstones.
- The overall preservation of the remains was poor to very poor.
- The disinterred remains were reburied in the Kempton Park (Bredell) Municipal Cemetery.

1 INTRODUCTION

PGS Heritage was contracted by *Noelene Enterprises* to relocate an informal cemetery, situated on Portion 43 of the Farm Mooifontein 14-IR, Kempton Park, Gauteng, that would be negatively affected by the implementation of development activities. A total of twenty three (23) graves were initially identified. One grave had a very large cement slab covering it. It was considered that as many as four graves could be located under the dressing, bringing the total number of possible graves to twenty-six (26). Eight (8) of the graves had formal grave dressings, but only five (5) had legible or semi-legible inscriptions. On exhumation, out of the initial Twenty-three (23) graves counted, one proved to be not a grave (CHL 013) and one contained the remains of three individuals (CHK 017A, 017B, 017C). Therefore, in total the remains of Twenty-four (24) individuals were exhumed and relocated. The oldest known grave dated back to 20 February 1872 (Jantien van der Veen) and the most recent dated to March 1934 (Hendrik Johannes Albertyn). The overall preservation of the remains was poor to very poor. The remains were exhumed between 18 and 20 February 2013 and re-interred between 20 and 21 February. The disinterred remains were reburied in the Kempton Park (Bredell) Municipal Cemetery. One family member of one of the graves visited the original grave before it was exhumed and was present at the reinterment of this grave. No family members of any of the other graves came forward during the social consultation process.

2 SOCIAL CONSULTATION

A detailed social consultation process was conducted in order to identify the next-of-kin of the deceased and obtain their permission to relocate the graves from their current position. *PGS Heritage* made use of site notices and newspaper advertisements, as well as a newspaper article. No comments were received from any interested and affected parties as a result of the site notices or advertisement. As a result of the lack of information on the graves, PGS arranged with the *Beeld* newspaper to run an article about the possible relocation of the graves.

- **27 December 2007** - The social consultation started with the placement of bilingual legal notices at the site as required by legislation (see **Appendix B**). The notices were replaced periodically during site visits.
- **30 January 2008** - Similar notices were published in the *Beeld* (the most widely read Afrikaans newspaper in Gauteng) (refer **Appendix C1**).
- **18 March 2008** - The article appeared in the Johannesburg print edition of the *Beeld* and on the *Beeld* website on the same day (refer to **Appendix C2**).

The article gave the background to the project and encouraged any interested and affected parties to contact us should they have any information regarding the graves. As a direct result of the article we were contacted by Ms. Gladys Wilken, a granddaughter of the late Adriana Catharina White, one of the deceased. Once we had fully explained to her why grave relocation was a possibility, Ms. Wilken gave us written permission to relocate the grave of the late Adriana Catharina White (**Appendix D**).

As a further result of the newspaper article, we received correspondence from Mr. Hennie Brits, a partner in the law firm of Blignaut Britz Attorneys in Jeffreys Bay. In his correspondence Mr. Brits stated that he represented persons who were all grandchildren of the late Adriana Catharina White (they are also siblings):

- Maria Magdalena Martenzina White (Brits), born 02/03/1935
- Adriana Catharina White (Robinson), born 08/10/1939
- Gezina Catharina White (Barnard), born 15/04/1941

Initially, Mr. Brits stated that he was aware that PGS had received permission from Ms. Gladys Wilken for the relocation of the remains of Adriana Catharina White, but that his clients also had a say in the matter. Mr. Brits furthermore stated that his clients needed certain information before they could make a decision regarding the relocation of the graves. The information requested was regarding the proposed use of property, the commercial value of the property, the possibility of financial benefit and whether there were alternatives to relocating the graves.

PGS addressed Mr. Brits's questions in detail by letter. We explained the whole process and clearly stated the reasons for the planned relocation. It was also made clear that no compensation was to be paid to any person as a result of the relocation. After a three month delay, repeated phone calls and another letter, Mr. Brits sent us a letter (dated 2008/07/07) stating that his clients do not give permission for the relocation of the graves. No reasons were given for this decision (this correspondence was submitted to SAHRA with the permit application of 2008 and has not been reproduced in this report).

At this point we were instructed by our client to continue with the permit application process. A permit for relocation of the graves was issued by SAHRA APM Unit (**Appendix E1**) and by the Gauteng Forensic Pathology Department, both in 2008 (**Appendix E2**).

NB: However, in the interim, there was an extended delay on the client's side in obtaining the finalized township establishment and section 82 certificate. This was only finalized in 2012 (see letter from

client – **Appendix F**). The SAHRA permit had therefore expired (since it was issued in 2008), so PGS Heritage re-submitted the application to the Burial Grounds and Graves Unit of SAHRA for renewal. The legal notices required in terms of the relevant legislation were re-published in the Beeld and the Daily Sun newspapers (**Appendix G**) and a new application was submitted to the Gauteng Department of Health. The family member who previously gave consent for the removal (Mrs Gladys Wilken) renewed her consent (**Appendix H**). The other family members who were previously represented by Mr Brits, indicated via Mr Brits that Mrs Wilkin was the final authority regarding permission for the grave relocation (pers.com HS Steyn, 18/09/2012).

3 LEGAL COMPLIANCE

Exhumation and re-interment of human remains in Gauteng is governed by the National Health Act (No 61 of 2003) and Section 2(1) of the Removal of Graves and Dead Bodies Ordinance 1925 (No 7 of 1925). The graves and mortal remains of victims of conflict and graves older than 60 years in a burial ground not administered by a local authority, as well as all graves older than 100 years, are also subject to the stipulations of the National Heritage Resources Act (Act 25 of 1999). All local laws and by-laws regarding cemeteries must also be adhered to.

In order to comply with the above, permissions to exhume and re-inter the human remains and associated grave dressings and cultural remains were obtained from the following responsible authorities in 2012 (refer **Appendix J** for copies):

- South African Heritage Resources Agency (SAHRA). Permit number BG/12/10/002/87 was issued in this regard.
- The Gauteng Department of Health.
- The Gauteng Department of Local Government and Housing
- The Ekurhuleni District Municipality.
- The office of the Station Commissioner of the South African Police Services in Norkem Park (Chloorkop) was informed of the date of exhumation seven days before the exhumation took place.

4 METHODOLOGY

4.1 Method of excavation

The methods employed during exhumation are aimed to recover all the remains, to minimise damage to the remains, to record the three-dimensional context of the remains and to preserve and respect

the dignity of the buried individual. All evidence that might allude to the events leading to the death of the individual and circumstances regarding the event were recorded and interpreted.

The excavation methods employed accomplished the *in situ* exposure of the burial and associated artefacts (Nienaber and Steyn, 1999). The focus was on accurate and complete documentation (Nienaber, 1997). Various methods for the excavation of graves have been proposed by different authors (Hester, 1975; Joukowsky, 1980; Krogman and Iscan, 1986; Morse, 1978) and all stress the need for adequate workspace around the exposed remains and a systematic approach to the removal of individual bones. Archaeological methods, including extensive test trenching to prevent damage to the remains, were employed. This approach was largely similar to that of forensic archaeology where buried cases are concerned. This approach was adapted for each situation since graves vary in shape, size, depth and content (Nienaber, 1999). The methods used in forensic archaeology are discussed by Steyn, *et.al.* (2000).

In each case, the surface features of the grave were cleaned and documented. Hereafter, any cultural material associated with the surface dressing was collected and catalogued, if such occurred. All observations regarding construction, materials and characteristics of the surface features were documented.

After the removal of the surface features, the extent of the burial pit was ascertained through excavation and observation of differences in the matrix. After the indications of the presence and characteristics of the burial pit were documented, the in-fill was excavated to expose the human remains and associated cultural materials. Removal of the matrix of the burial pit was accomplished through the test-trench approach, whereby a narrow trench (25-30 cm wide) is excavated with a trowel to a depth of between 15 and 20 cm in the lower third of the burial pit (in this instance the lower third usually constitutes the eastern side of the grave). This area is chosen since it is most likely that the femurs of the skeleton occur in this part of the grave. Since the femur is a robust bone, it is usually not easily damaged through excavation. If no indications of the presence of human remains were observed in the test trench, the remaining in-fill matrix, down to the depth of the test trench, was removed with a shovel. The matrix surrounding the remains was carefully screened to retrieve any possible cultural artefacts associated with the burial. This process was repeated until indications of the presence of human remains were observed.

As soon as human remains were encountered, care was taken to leave as much of the skeleton as possible covered in order to protect the remains from damage by excavation and to preserve the integrity of the context of the skeletal elements and possible associated cultural remains. The extent

and characteristics of the burial pit were now documented and the workspace was assessed and enlarged if not sufficient. This was only done after documentation of the features of the burial pit without sacrificing any vital information.

The excavation then continued, with the aim of ascertaining the extent of the skeletal remains and the location of the different skeletal elements, after which the remains were uncovered, starting from the middle and working outwards. This method again ensures the minimum disturbance of the remains and associated cultural materials. As soon as the skeleton was uncovered, it was documented *in situ* and removed. A further test trench of 15 cm deep was dug in the area directly underlying the location of the remains to ensure that all possible remains and artefacts were found and recovered.

5 EXHUMATION OF REMAINS AND DETAILS OF DECEASED

5.1 General discussion

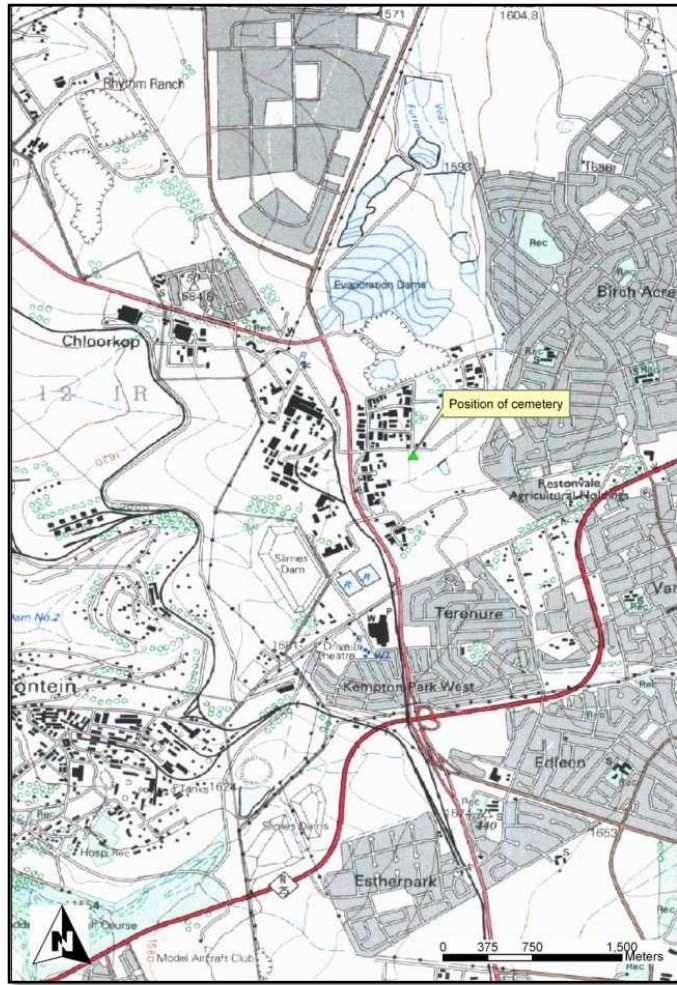


Figure 1 - Locality Map, showing position of cemetery

The graves were located in an informal cemetery which was situated on Portion 43 of the Farm Mooifontein 14-IR, Kempton Park, Gauteng at S26.06943 E28.19069. The cemetery was situated in an industrial area known as Chloorkop. This property will in future be known as Chloorkop Extension 48. The graves were located in the middle of plot number 5343, approximately 2482m², making any development on the property impossible unless the graves were relocated. The development and affected property are zoned for industrial purposes (refer **Figure 1** and **Appendix A**) for a map of the development.

A total of twenty-three graves were identified initially. One grave had a very large cement slab covering it and was considered that as many as four graves could be located under the dressing, bringing the total number of graves to twenty-six. Eight of the graves had formal grave dressings, but only five had legible or semi- legible inscriptions. The graves were arranged in four rows containing (from west to east) 3, 10, 3 and 6 graves respectively. The oldest known grave dated back to 20 February 1872 (Jantien van der Veen) and the most recent March 1934 (Hendrik Johannes Albertyn).

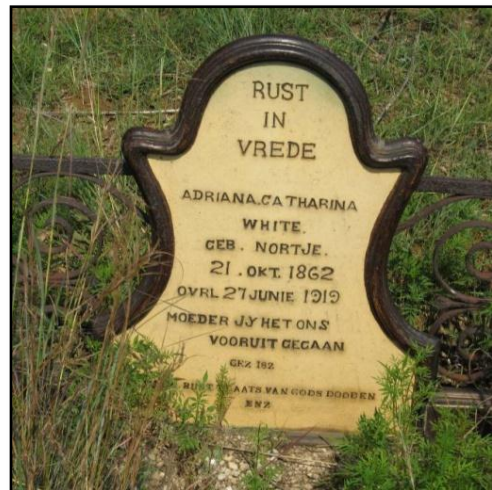


Figure 3 - Headstone of CH 002 (Adriana Catharina White)

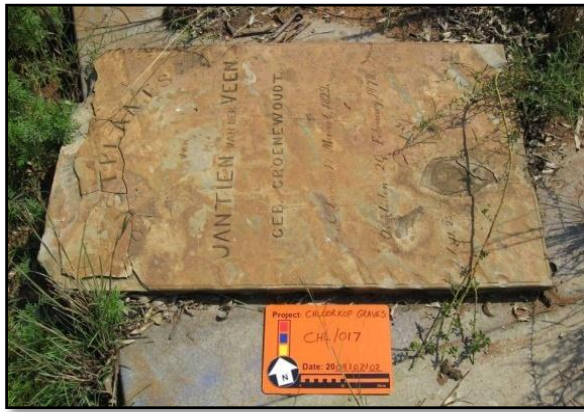


Figure 4 - The oldest headstone in the cemetery, dating back to 1872 (CH17)

The graves were identified during clearing for construction work on the property. No Environmental Impact Assessment or Heritage Impact Assessment had been conducted on the property prior to the commencement of activities associated with construction. According to the client, this was not required as part of the establishment of the township.

The remains in the graves were exhumed between 18 and 19 February 2013 and re-interred between 20 and 21 February 2013. On exhumation, out of the original twenty-three (23) graves counted, one proved to be not a grave (CHL 013) and one contained the remains of three individuals (CHK 017A, 017B, 017C). Therefore, in total the remains of twenty-four (24) individuals were exhumed and relocated. One family member (Mrs Gladys Wilken) visited the original grave before it was exhumed and was present at the re-interment of this grave (CHL 002). The other graves were unknown and no family members had contacted *PGS Heritage* or the developer as a result of the social consultation process. All of the human remains were re-interred in new graves at the Kempton Park (Bredell) Municipal Cemetery.

The description of the exhumation of the individual graves follows below.

Description of human remains:	The remains were that of a small child in a very poor state of preservation. Only a few unidentifiable fragments of bone were recovered.

Measurements of grave pit:	1.95m (l) x 1m (w) x 1.8m (d).
Depth at which cultural remains were found:	Nothing was found.
Depth at which human remains were found:	1.8m
Burial position:	The individual was buried in a coffin and was placed in a supine position with her head at the western end. Both arms were flexed and were placed across the chest. Both legs were extended and were placed next to each other.

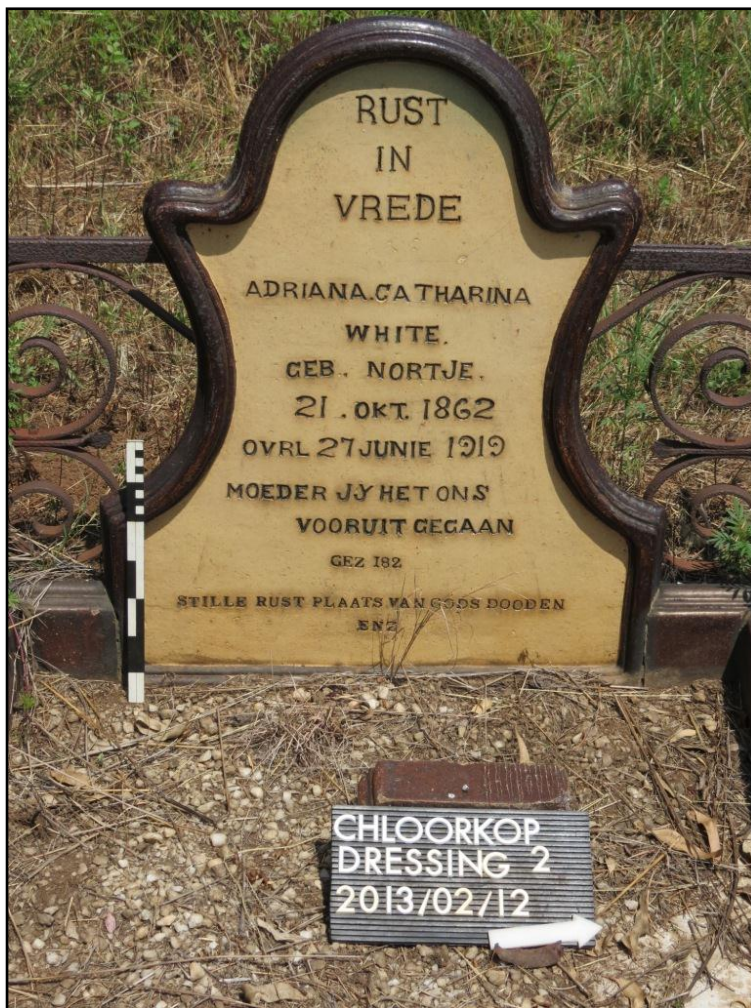


Figure 9 - CHL 002, Headstone

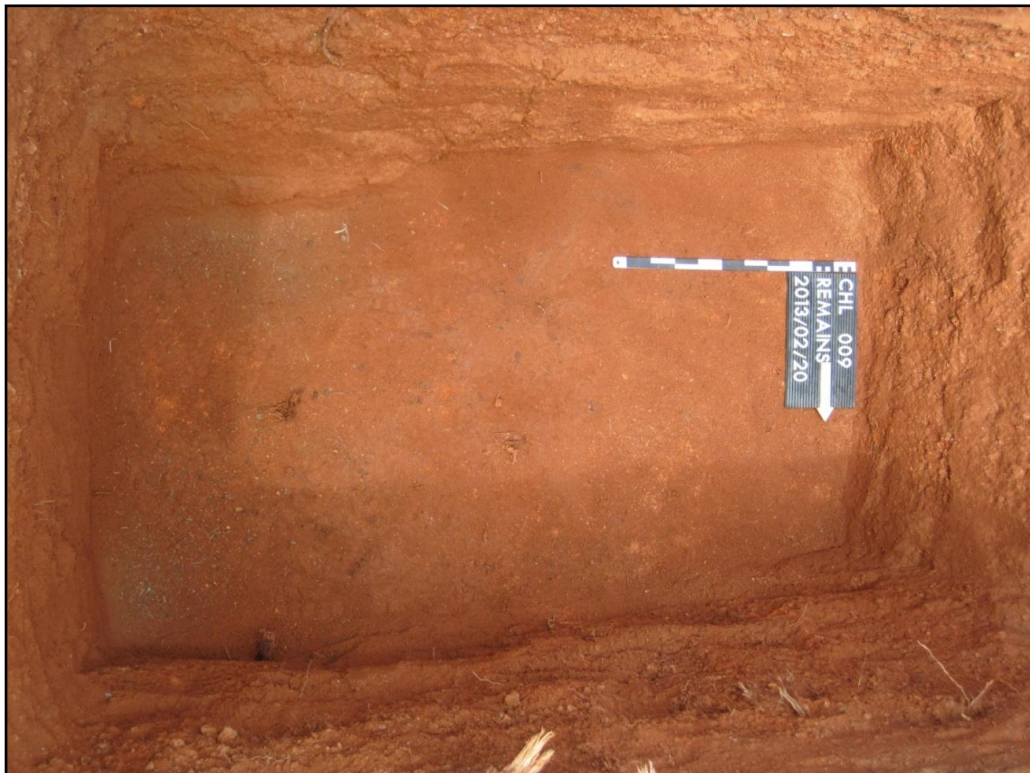


Figure 24 – CHL 009 Remains

5.3 Conclusion

During the relocation process, human remains from twenty-four (24) graves were relocated from Portion 43 of the Farm Mooifontein 14-IR, Kempton Park, Gauteng, on 21 February 2013. From the twenty-three (23) graves counted, one proved to be not a grave (CHL 013) and one contained the remains of three individuals (CHK 017A, 017B, 017C). Therefore, in total the remains of 24 individuals were exhumed and relocated. All the individuals were found buried in a supine position or found with evidence of being buried in a coffin. Apart from the coffins and one grave containing a sheet of corrugated iron, no cultural remains were found in association with the remains. From the estimated age distribution this cemetery indicates that the community who used this cemetery had a high morbidity rate as 13 of the 24 graves (54%) are of small children. The overall preservation of the remains was poor to very poor. The preservation of the child graves was poor, in some cases leaving little trace of human remains, because of the porous nature of developing bone. All the disinterred remains were reburied in the Kempton Park (Bredell) Municipal Cemetery. One family member of one of the graves visited the original grave before it was exhumed and was present at the reinterment of this grave (CHL 002).

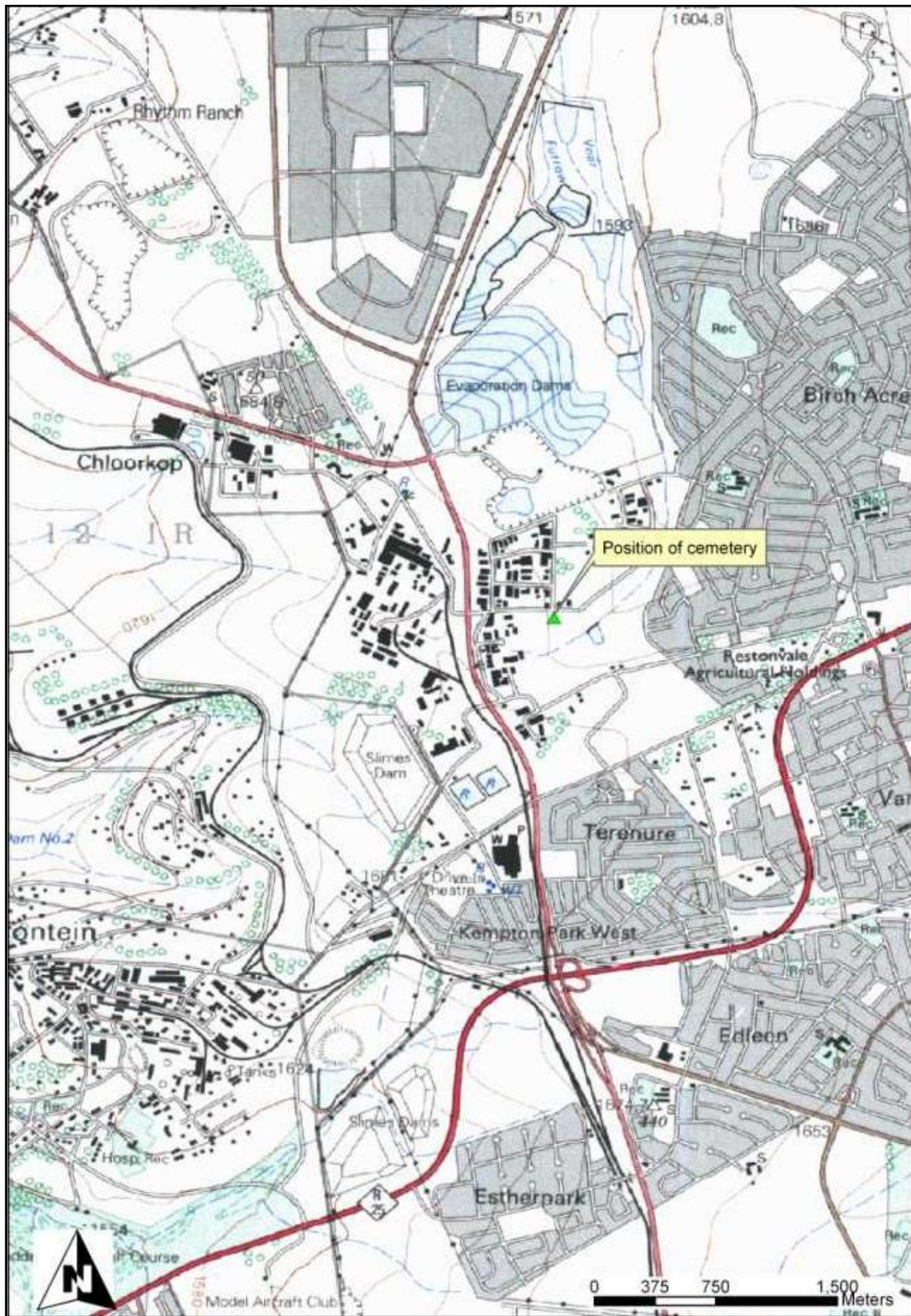


Figure 54 – General Locality Map

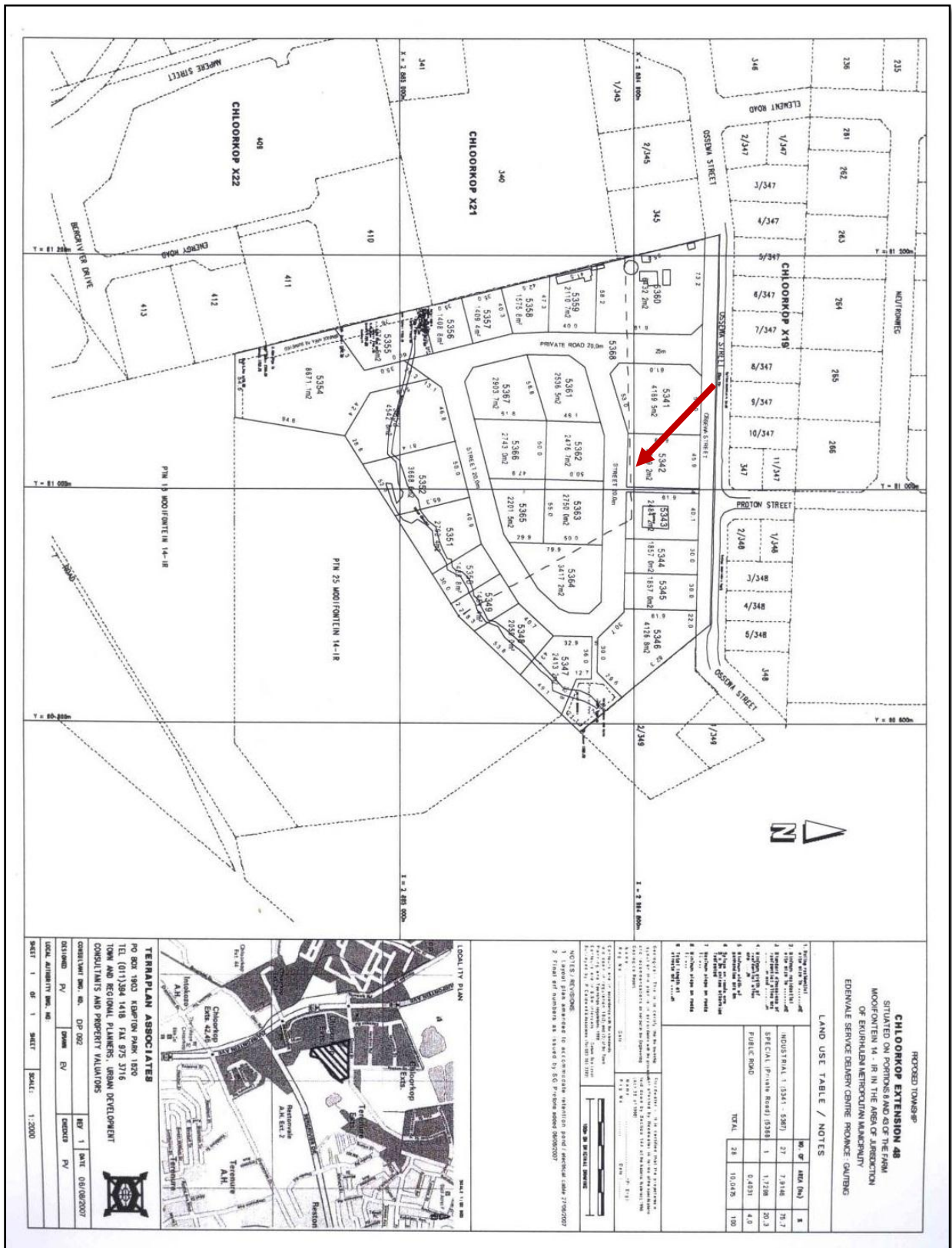
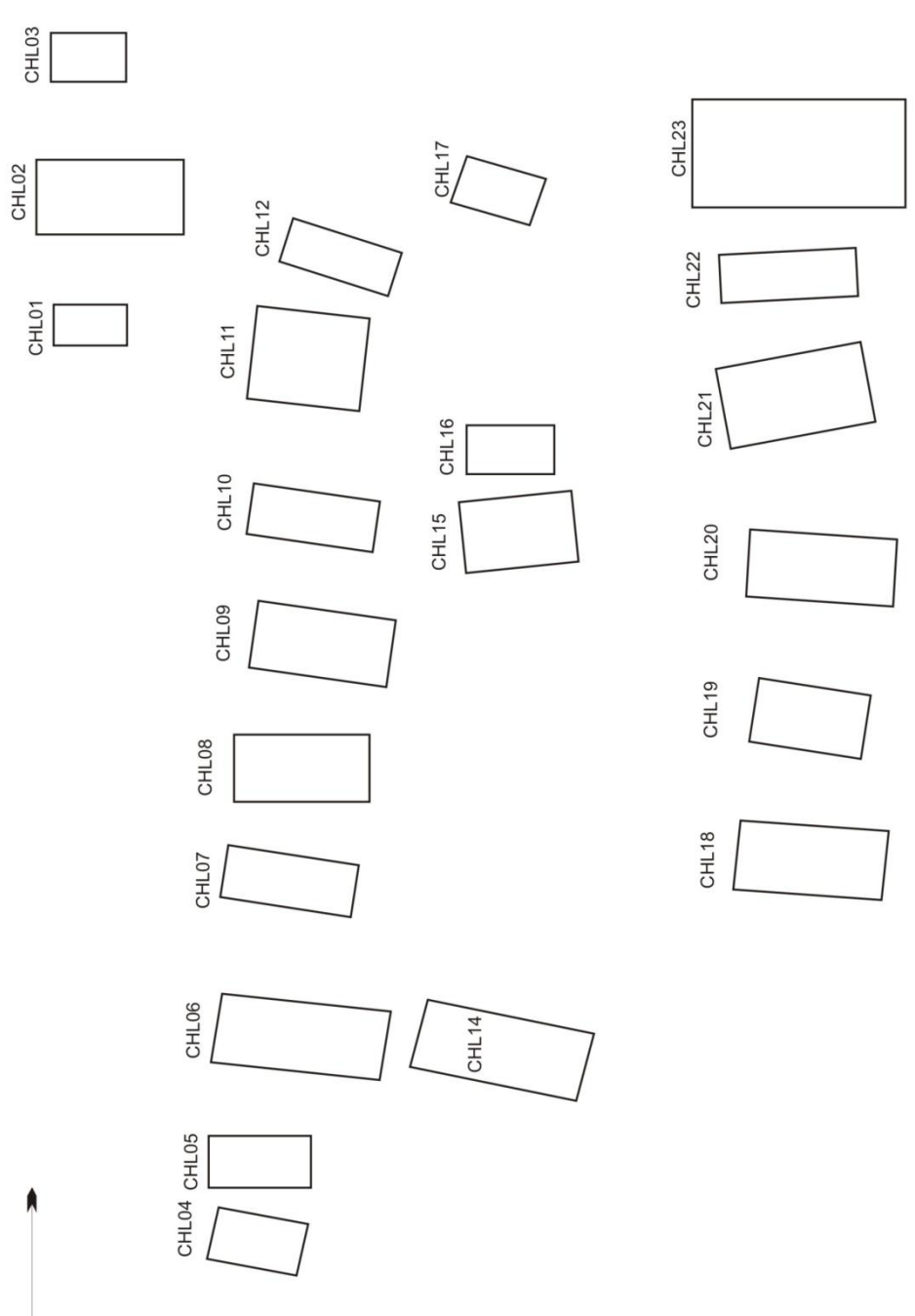


Figure 55 - Approximate location of the cemetery (red arrow) inside the development area

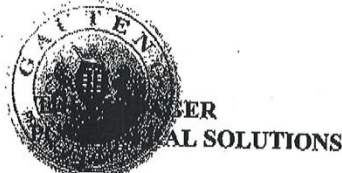

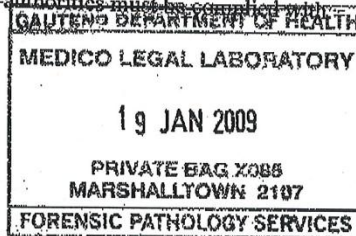

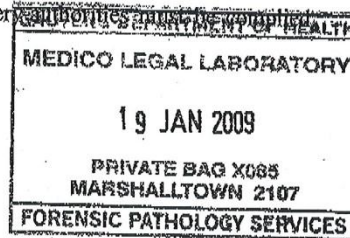
