Issued in terms of Section 35(4) of the National Heritage Resources Act, 1999 (Act 25 of 1999) and Regulation 3(3)(a) of PN 298 (29 August 2003)

This permit is valid for three years from the date of issue

Your application for the proposed destructive testing of samples from Human Remains uncovered at Sayers Lane was circulated via email to Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Committee (APM) on 25 September 2019. An email decision was agreed to due to the nature of the application.

DECISION:

Members of the Archaeology, Palaeontology and Meteorites Committee have recorded via email their approval of the application for a permit to conduct destructive analysis and testing of samples from Sayers Lane and endorse the methodology.

This permit is issued for:

Proposed Action: Destructive analysis and testing

Site: Erf 4998, Sayers Lane, Simons Town

Conditions applicable to this Permit:

1. Adequate recording methods as specified in the Regulations and Guidelines pertaining to the National Heritage Resources Act must be used.
2. A final report, in both digital and hardcopy format, **MUST** be submitted to HWC on or before 26 September 2022. An extension to this permit can be granted on submission of a progress report (if work was initiated) and a letter stating reasons for the extension. HWC reserves the right to withhold further permits if progress is not deemed satisfactory.
3. Reprints of all published papers or copies of theses or reports resulting from this work must be lodged with HWC.
4. If a published report has not appeared within three years of the lapsing of this permit, the report in terms of the permit will be made available to researchers on request.
5. It is the responsibility of the permit holder to obtain permission from the landowner for each visit, and conditions of access imposed the landowner must be observed.
6. HWC shall not be liable for any losses, damages or injuries to persons or properties as a result of any activities in connection with this permit.
7. HWC reserves the right to cancel this permit by notice to the permit holder.

NOTE:

- This decision is subject to an **appeal period of 14 working days**.
- The applicant is required to inform any party who has expressed a bona fide interest in any heritage-related aspect of this record of decision. The appeal period shall be taken from the date above. It should be noted that for an appeal to be deemed valid it must refer to the decision. It must be submitted by the due date and it must set out the grounds of the appeal. Appeals must be addressed to the official named above and it is the responsibility of the appellant to confirm that the appeal has been received within the appeal period.
- **Work may NOT be initiated during this 14 day appeal period.**
- This approval does not exonerate the applicant from obtaining any necessary approval from any other applicable statutory authority.
- an export permit must be applied for from SAHRA in respect of any archaeological or palaeontological material that will be exported.
- **A copy of this permit must be displayed in a prominent place on the site until the permitted work is completed.**
